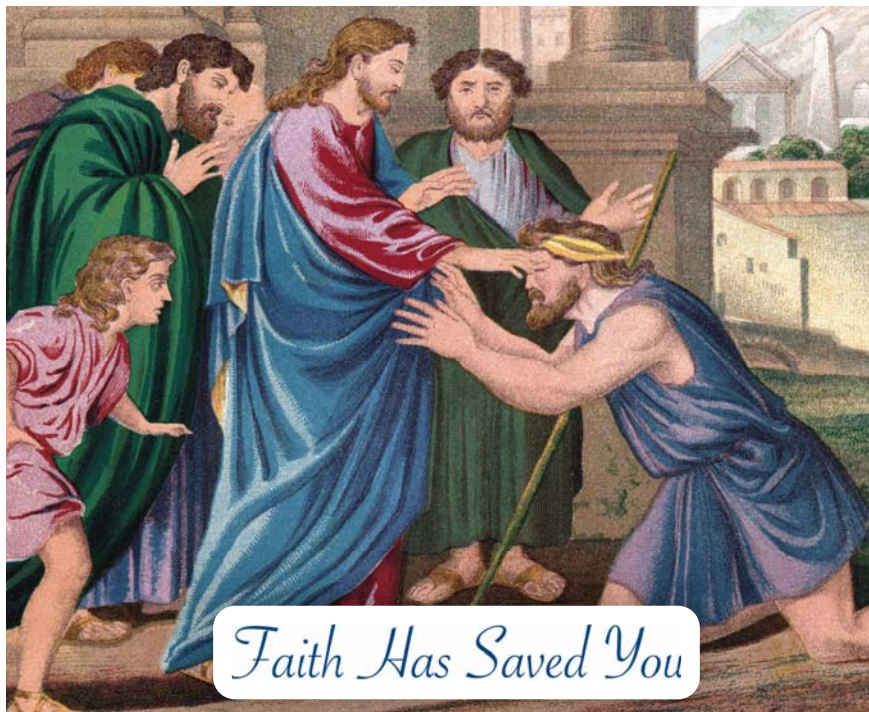

Stump the Deacon!

Can Catholics celebrate Halloween?



In a word: yes. Despite what Catholic detractors have maintained since the time of the Reformation Halloween has no pagan origins. It is the celebration of “All Hallows Eve”, the eve of All Saints Day which honors our “great Multitude of Saints” and has been celebrated by the church since the early eighth century. The closest tie to paganism would be to the Celtic Harvest Festival where they would carve turnips (or pumpkins in America) and children would go from door to door collecting treats. The idea of ghosts and goblins roaming the night comes more from the Catholic beliefs than from the pagans. It was believed that on Halloween it was easier for spirits, good or bad, to be seen prowling around. Movie makers have commercialized and exploited this idea with ever more gory and bloody horror flicks. The attacks on Halloween both past and present come mainly from those who oppose anything Catholic and despite what they may claim Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI has never said anything about Halloween much less condemned it. While the Church has no official stand on Halloween one way or another, it can be a reminder that there are very real and very evil spirits in this world but it should also be a celebration of our belief in the communion we hold with all the saints in heaven.

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME FESTIVALS

This Sunday the Scriptures, especially the first reading, remind us of God's faithfulness. Any reading of the Scriptures will remind us that God is faithful. He is true to his promises, merciful, compassionate and loving. Even when countless generations ignored his prophets and turned away from his commandments, God remained faithful to his covenant. God has remained faithful to us, to the covenant he made with us at Baptism, accepting us as his own. Faithfulness should inspire faithfulness. As we celebrate our Fall Festival, we are reminded of the many parishioners who have and the many parishioners who still give of their time, talents and gifts that we might have a successful Festival.

This year our Fall Festival has been dedicated to George and Helen Fairchild,



two parishioners who came to the parish around 1976, having served faithfully at St. Maurice parish in New Orleans at festivals there. Their daughter, Joan Gonthier, showed me photographs of their booth which were taken from 1982-1993. Each year they had a booth called the Parade of Prizes. Joan told me that every year George would work all year going to stores and

businesses trying to get fifty good prizes for their booth. They usually had one really good prize, like a television set and then other smaller but still, good prizes. Joan told me that when cleaning out the barn she found an old spinning wheel, over thirty years old, that they also used in conjunction with the Festival. She said they would arrive early in the morning every day of the Festival and set up the booth, then take it all down at night, returning the next morning to set it up again. The raffle drum which we still use was made by him.



It will be a real pleasure to dedicate the Festival to them this year. As I said above, faithfulness inspires faithfulness. I truly believe it is the dedication of so many parishioners who worked here in so many ways over the years that inspires this generation, and will inspire generations to come, that working together, our parish might all the better carry out the mission entrusted to us by our loving God. On a personal note, I was told that this was our 46th Festival. Just a coincidence I have been ordained 46 years. So it would seem that in 1969, I was ordained in March and the first Festival was celebrated in May. I love coincidences like this.

Supplying the Ceremonies is a phrase I have been used to since ordination. Often times when an infant is born and in danger of death, either a priest, deacon or nurse will share baptism with the newborn infant. Later when the infant is stronger the parents can arrange to bring him or her to the church where, together with the families and godparents, we share the ceremonies – anointing, white robe, candle, etc. which we were not able to do in the natal unit. The church recently has recommended a similar service for young people who were baptized in another Christian denomination and who wish to live as Catholics. Though not necessary, it gives us a chance to celebrate their acceptance of the Catholic faith within the context of ritual or ceremonies,



making the change hopefully more meaningful for them. Earlier this month we celebrated with Lucas Aaron Gillen and Kamden Ryan Colvin their reception into the church. Because they were already baptized, we simply welcomed them,


anointed them and shared with them the flame from the Easter Candle. It is nice to have them and their families with us. They are in the second grade and will be receiving the Eucharist for the first time with their classmates during the Easter Season. Thanks Lucas and Kamden. It is great to have you with us.

As we move through October and the Fall Festival into November, the Book of Remembrance will be out next weekend. Have a good week. Love,

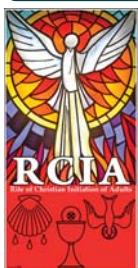
