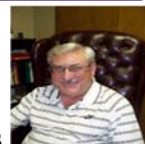

Stump the Deacon!

Was Jesus really born on December 25?



This question has been debated for 2,000 years and some Church Fathers questioned whether it should be celebrated at all. No one today knows for sure when Jesus was born. At the time they did not keep records as we do today. The early Christians were far more concerned with when Jesus died. We are told that he died during the Jewish Feast of Passover which would be in the Spring close to the Spring Equinox roughly March 23. Some early fathers felt that it would be appropriate for Jesus to be conceived (to begin His life on earth) at the beginning of Spring so they set the celebration of the Annunciation on March 25. Nine months later would be December 25. None of this was much of an issue until the mid-4th century when Christianity could finally be practiced openly. The first clear date for Christmas was December 25, 336 although it had probably been celebrated on December 25 for 50 to 100 years already.

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: PATIENT WAITING

This Sunday as we begin the Fourth Week of Advent, with Christmas only days away, it is appropriate for the Church to shine a light on Mary, the mother of God. Of course, Jesus is and always will be the center of attention, but Mary's humble obedience and cooperation helped make his coming a reality. To grow in our love for Jesus and to be with God one day in heaven, we must all strive



to imitate Mary's example of being faithful and open to God and God's plan for our lives. Just as she helped her cousin Elizabeth, Mary continues to help us believe in God's promises. Our second reading says Jesus told the Father, "I have come to do your will." As you well know, these words were in Mary's heart also. May they also be in our hearts now as we move toward Christmas and always.

Many thanks to Hannah Duhe for painting the Christmas card we were able to mail to parishioners this



Christmas. She painted a Christmas painting which is now hanging in the parish office. From the painting the printer was able to make the beautiful cards we were happy to place in the mail last week. I began writing notes in the cards on September 25. This was my weekend and day off project until the last card was written December 8th. I have always done this since becoming pastor back in 1976, as I feel it is my one chance as pastor to personally contact each parishioner and speak with them individually by name. Many thanks to Hannah for making this possible this year.

Earlier this month as we celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, I met with nineteen Girl Scouts

who began work of Catholic Girl Scout Patches. Because their first patch was called the Immaculate Conception, we met the Sunday before and I offered an opening prayer and gave them a little talk on the Immaculate Conception. They will be working more in the coming months on other patches and eventually will be working on merit badges. I was told



that last year thirteen girl scouts received badges from the whole Diocese and we had nineteen from here working on them earlier this month. This is the first time the girls from our parish have done this and we appreciate those who work with them.

The Blessing of a Child in the Womb is something we began earlier this year on Trinity Sunday, and we will be praying this blessing again this Sunday at all Liturgies. The Bishop has requested that we celebrate this blessing twice a year and the Diocesan Office of Worship recommends it be done the Fourth Sunday of Advent and on Trinity Sunday. As with other special blessings and celebrations, we would ask the mother to come forward after the homily with whomever might be with you at this Eucharist. We will pray for all expectant mothers during the Prayers of the Faithful and conclude the Prayers of the Faithful with the Blessing. It is good for us to share their journey, and to remember them in prayer.



A REMINDER: The Mighty Moms will have their Holiday Pantry on Tuesday, December 29 from 10-12 near the drop-off for the Faith Formation Center. **They have asked us to collect Peanut Butter this month. We have placed a "Peanut Butter Box" in the church foyer which will remain there through the 27th of December. If you can help fill it – again and again – all, especially those we serve, will appreciate it.**

As we move closer to Christmas, let us remember all who journey with us to Bethlehem's crib in prayer that this be a good and graced Christmas for all. Love,

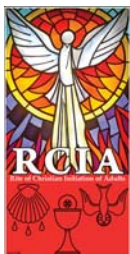

**A Vocation View: December 20, 2015
Fourth Sunday of Advent**
