## CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: GRATITUDE FOR GOD'S GIFTS

The Scriptures this Sunday speak of being sent and gifted. Certainly we have celebrated this in beautiful ways these past weeks – with Confirmation, with Ministry Appreciation Night, and in other significant ways.

Last weekend, we celebrated our gratitude to all those who serve in the various ministries in the parish, helping



us to fulfill the mission entrusted to us by the Lord. We were happy to have received over three hundred reservations and were happy to also welcome others who joined them.



The happy hour was good, the dinner was great, and so was the band, The Big River Express, but it was the happy evening and good fellowship that made it so special and happy for all, both youth and adults. On Sunday many parishioners leaving the Eucharist said how they had enjoyed themselves the evening before. We again thank all who minister in the parish.



I would like to share a personal note concerning my health. In November I received a diagnosis from my doctor which I shared with family and staff. I try to avoid two extremes, on one hand not making it a “big secret” and

on the other hand not being all “dramatic” with it. I am one who likes to avoid a lot of drama. But word does get around, and I thought the best thing to do would be to write about it in the bulletin, thus avoiding any misunderstanding or false ideas about what is going on. To make it simple, last year doctors recommended a biopsy on the prostate gland, and as they thought, there was cancer there. It hasn't metastasized, and they don't know how fast it has been growing. They thought it would be good to take a look at it in six months to see if and how much the cancer had grown. It usually grows slowly in a person my age, and that is a plus. The doctor gave me a booklet to explain this and what is called the Gleason score states that if cancer cells are rated 2-4, they are slow to grow and spread; if they are 5-7, they are intermediate; and if they are 8-10 they are likely to spread quickly. Mine are rated 6, which places me right in the middle. I have my next appointment in June. The doctor wanted to schedule me for the latter part of May, but I have vacation days planned. After all, first things first! 😊 After my return from Ireland, I will be seeing him and keep you posted. Thanks for your prayers.

Our Eucharistic Ministry to the Homebound serves many parishioners, and also involves a number of parishioners who serve in this ministry. We are happy to welcome Linda Leger, one of these ministers, who will



begin serving as coordinator of this ministry. This ministry began over thirty years ago in our parish and was coordinated for many years by Phyllis Hartman, in more recent years by Andrea Stafford and now by Linda Leger. We presently have 21 Eucharistic Ministers to the

Homebound serving Communion to approximately 45 parishioners. We try and divide the homebound within districts served by ministers who live nearby. If you are interested in this ministry, we encourage you to telephone the parish office at 665-5359, and we will be happy to help you.

It was a real pleasure to bless the gate with their plaques last Monday and we thank Paula Anderson for the kind and generous donation that made it possible.
