Passion (Palm) Sunday, March 20, 2016

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: TIME OF PURIFICATION

As we begin this Fifth Week of Lent, the season always seems to remind us of the beauty, the joy of having the chance of starting over. There is something about starting over -A new page - A new year - A new week - That feeling that the past is the past. It is a beautiful aspect of our faith and especially of this season that people who have messed up in some way get a second chance, and that they learn from their mistakes.

That concept of starting over flows through today's readings. In the first reading from Isaiah, we hear *"Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new."* And in the second reading, *"Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus."*

We have that second and third and infinite number of chances when we seek God's love. We stray off the path, but we can always find it again with God's help. This is so powerful and, I think, sometimes difficult for us to grasp. We feel we have to do something to earn love or that by our mistakes we have made ourselves unworthy (like we ever were! 😊). We find it hard to let go of the past, our resentments and grudges. We feel unworthy because we are human and make mistakes; we give in to the temptations that surround us. As Pope Francis says, we are wounded by sin. When we turn to God, we can be healed. We can ask forgiveness and be forgiven.

The parable in John's gospel is one of my own favorites. I wish I could have been there to see the scribes and the Pharisees who thought they had a "gotcha" moment. *"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her,"* Jesus tells them, as this poor woman stands there. Jesus goes back to tracing patterns in the dirt as the Pharisees and scribes melt away. Jesus does not condemn the woman either as he tells her to go and sin no more.

In my own world, when I feel judgmental of others, I need to remember that powerful phrase. I can strive to start over, to know that God will welcome me as I am. I can try to live that way in my own life. I can remember the verse before the Gospel where God says: *"Return to me with your whole heart, for I am gracious and merciful."* I pray that I return to God every day, with a whole heart, a healed heart, that every day can be a new beginning. Let us pray for one another as we journey through this season of new beginnings, fresh starts, and the joy and peace that come from them.

As we moved through Lent it was good to welcome new altar servers. Practicing two Sundays ago and hopefully



now serving are: **Anh Tu Nguyen, Parker Smith, Mahkenze Bonczek, and Alex Polk.** Photographed with them is **Sabrina Patterson** who served for many years and offered to assist with the servers. We thank all five for their ministries among us.

It is good to welcome Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio to the parish this weekend. While he will be introducing himself to you this Sunday after the Gospel and homily, I just wanted to remind you again of schedule changes because of the mission: We will have Eucharist at 8:30 in the morning as usual, but will also celebrate the Eucharist at 6:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday during the mission. We scheduled it for 6:00, because this way people won't be arriving during the Eucharist for the mission which begins at 7:00 p.m.. Those coming to the 6:00 Eucharist, might wish to spend the twenty minutes or so between Eucharist and mission in quiet prayer that it be a good mission for all. Also on Wednesdays of Lent we don't usually have a 6:00 Eucharist because of The Light Is On for You which begins at 6:00. **This Wednesday, there will be no Reconciliation Wednesday evening, only Eucharist at 6:00 and mission talk at 7:00. Instead, there will be a Communal Reconciliation Service after the 7:00 Mission Talk on Tuesday. Several priests will be coming from around the deanery to assist us with Reconciliation. We have already said this several times and in several ways over the past weeks, but sometimes you cannot mention changes too often.**

Monday at 7:00, Dr. D'Ambrosio will speak on Temperance, Key to Freedom; on Tuesday at 7:00, Who Needs Reconciliation; and on Wednesday at 7:00, A Year of Mercy. I hope this week will be a good and graced week for all. Let us keep one another in prayer. Have a good week, Love,
