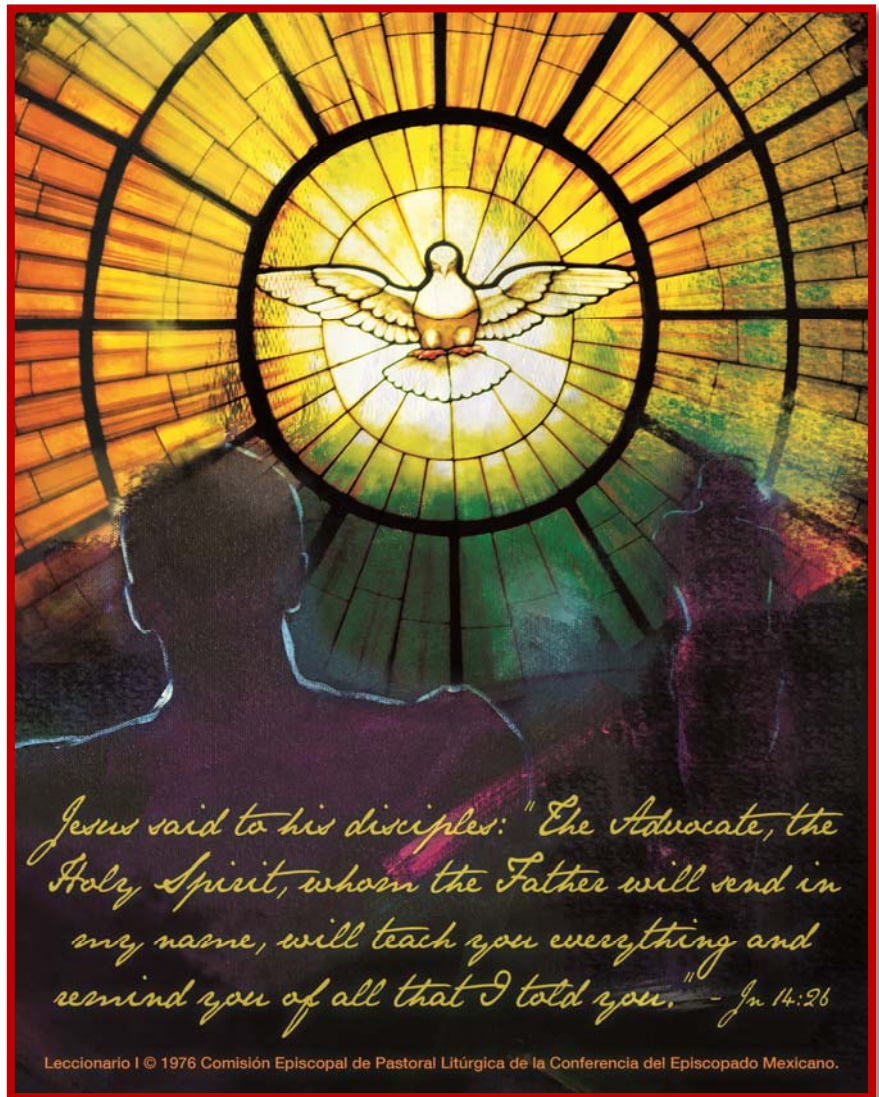

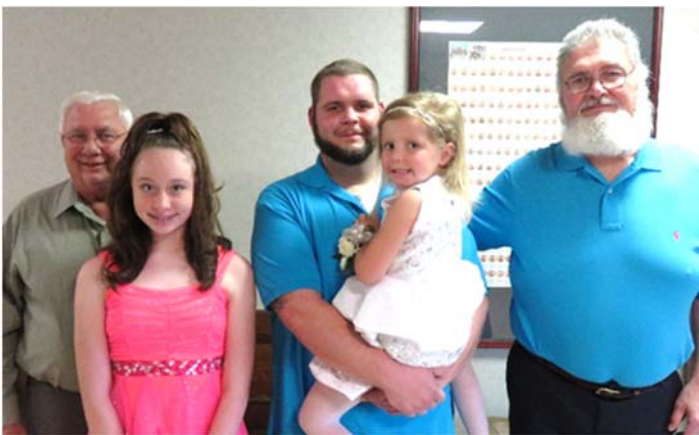


CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: EASTER BLESSINGS

As we continue through the Easter Season, on this Sixth Sunday of Easter we remember it has been six weeks since we began the celebration of the Lord's resurrection, but happily the story didn't end there. For the past six weeks we have walked with the Risen Lord and next week we will celebrate his Ascension into Heaven. While the Ascension marked the end of his earthly life, Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel that we will never walk alone, that he will continue to be present to us at all times and all places. Jesus offers those beautiful words in today's Gospel, "do not let your hearts be troubled." They would never walk alone, and if that wasn't enough, Jesus would prepare a place for them. These words continue to be our hope and joy, not only at Easter, but throughout our lives, even in the most distressing of times.

As we continued through Easter, the parish hall was busy with a number of good, happy activities:

Please help a young group of Catholic adults as they prepare for their mission trip to HONDURAS. Many times people have the desire to do mission work but are not able to. Giving donations is a great way to get involved because it is with your donations they are able to have a successful mission. High Needs:

1. Scientific calculators
2. School supplies (notebooks, pens, markers, crayons, paper, pencils, backpacks, scientific calculators, etc.)
3. Religious items (rosaries, medals, scapulars, saint cards, Catholic literature in Spanish, Spanish Bibles)
4. Toiletries: baby clothes, diapers, baby wipes
6. Jump drives (middle school and high school students need these to do projects for school at local computer labs)
7. Medical supplies (Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Band-Aids, first aid kits, etc)

These items that they bring with them go to the poorest families in the communities our mission works in. The mission has an extensive education sponsorship program that helps children have the opportunity to get an education that may never have that chance. We have participated in assisting them over the past years, and it is a real joy to be a part of something so good that these young adults do in our name.
