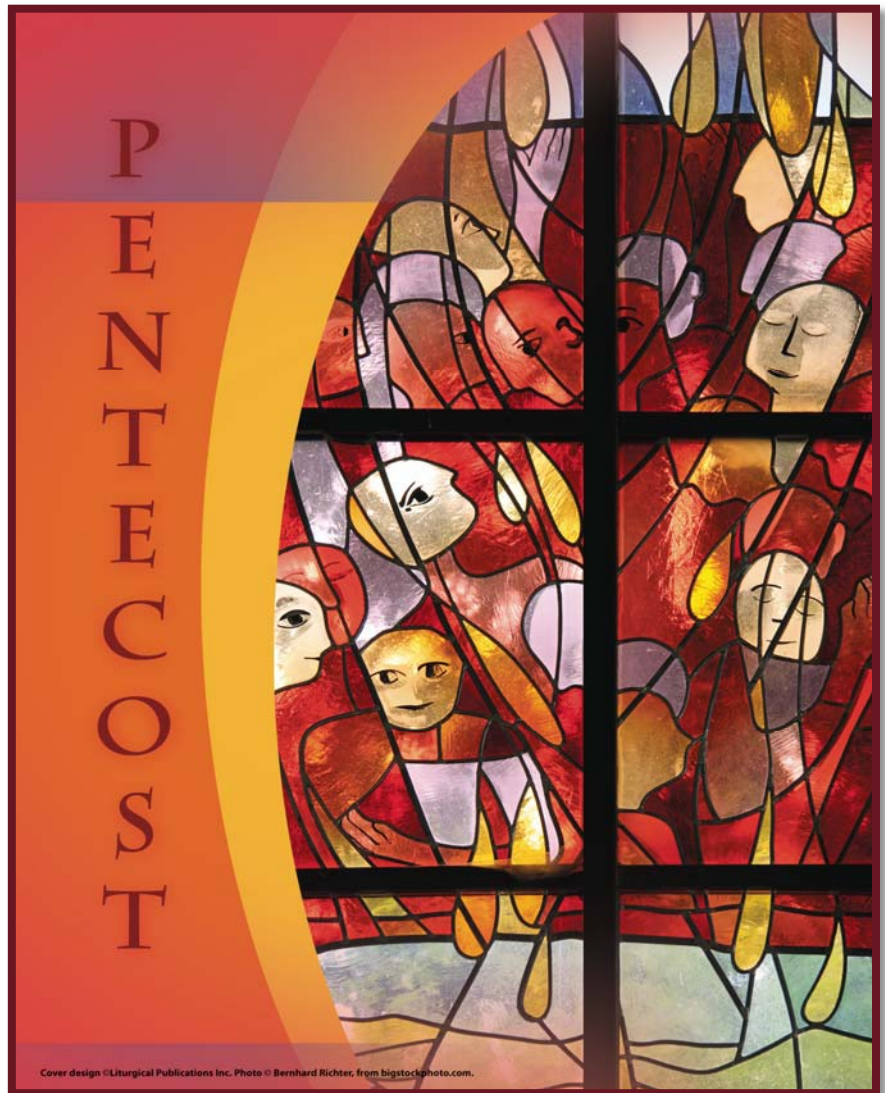

Why is the Bible, particularly the Old Testament, so high on “Fear of the Lord”?

The Book of Proverbs says “fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom” (Proverbs 1:7). One of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, taken from Isaiah 11:2, is fear of the Lord. Should we be afraid of God? Fear, like pain, can be good for us or bad for us. Pain certainly hurts us but it can also warn us of other deeper problems or teach us what to avoid in the future. Fear that is so great that it paralyzes us is not good for us but fear can also help us avoid greater dangers. This is the type of fear the bible is encouraging. God does not want us to be afraid of him. He is always reaching out to us with His mercy and love. What we need to cultivate is a healthy respect for His power and majesty and a healthy fear of rejecting that love. CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: THE DAY OF PENTECOST

As we bring the Easter Season to its conclusion, on this **Day of the Pentecost** we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit, our most welcome guest. In the life of the Church, Christmas, Easter and Pentecost are designated as solemnities of equal rank and importance. They present us with loving action of the Holy Trinity, of a loving God who gave us his only begotten Son whose mission it was to fill us with God's life-giving Spirit. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church. The Apostles had locked themselves up in the upper room in fear until the Holy Spirit filled them with the gifts needed to accomplish our loving God's purpose. Pope Francis continues to encourage us to engage in our culture, not to condemn it, but to love it enough to save it. We live in a world in need of healing, and we pray that as the Holy Spirit brought unity and purpose into the lives of those first disciples, that same Spirit may help us, the Church, here and throughout the world to share that healing mercy which has been first shared with us.

Celebrating the gift of the Divine Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation today at the Cathedral are **Anthony Ho-A-Sim** and **Phyllis Doucet** who were



prepared for the reception of this sacrament by **Terry Badeaux**. Bishop Muench will be confirming them in their faith at the noon Eucharist. Let us keep them in our prayers on this special day.

The Grill Is On for You brings us all together as we bring the Easter Season to a conclusion. I hope you will be able to join us. We have games for the children and lots of good food.

The CommUnity Hands Fish Fry will be this Friday, May 20. It is a beautiful two-fold ministry for while it helps us minister to the needs of the poor among us, it is also

one of the most visible expressions of our Christian Unity in Livingston Parish. In my mind, it involves more churches from various denominations than any ministry in Livingston Parish, and there are many good reasons to offer it our prayerful and financial support.

Tomorrow morning after the 8:30 Eucharist, I will head to the airport for a 12:21 flight and the first leg of my trip to Ireland. I have a general plan which is to spend a week in Dublin, renewing acquaintances and enjoying the company of those who e-mail me with family information through the year. I will be celebrating the Eucharist one day at St. Nicholas of Myra Parish and visiting with friends there. It was the last parish where my O'Connor Family (my grandmother's father and his family) lived before leaving for New Orleans in 1832. Another day I will be celebrating Eucharist and renewing acquaintances in St. Andrew's Parish where my great-grandfather was baptized and his parents celebrated marriage. Through the week, I will be doing a bit of research and some plain ol' vacation tourist things, getting together with friends, making new ones; and next Monday, the 23rd, I will be catching the bus for Cashel, where a number of my O'Brien ancestors (ancestors of the O'Connors) are buried. The Rock of Cashel is up on a hill and contains the ruins of an old monastery and Cathedral where some family are buried. More to follow on this next week.

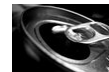
Fr. Thomas Carroll or one of the priests who minister with him will be our guest in the parish next weekend. While I am in Dublin I will remember you at the Sunday Eucharist, he will be here, having been recommended to preach on his ministry by the Diocesan Missionary Cooperative Plan. Often the missionaries recommended are from the foreign missions, and it will be a change of pace this year to welcome a priest missionary who works in Appalachia, in the Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky. They have established a Catholic High School which is tuition free for the poorest of the poor. They depend upon the donations received from special collections taken around the United States, and occasionally volunteers teach at the school for a year. The school is accredited and continues to grow, having graduated its first class in 1994. A lot of work with the poor reaches beyond the boundaries of the school and volunteers from around the country help with projects in the larger community. The priest who comes next week to represent them will give more information. **I say this now however, that you will know there will be a second collection taken at all Liturgies for the work of these priests who serve in the mountain missions of Eastern Kentucky.**

Let us unite in prayer today for each other and all those to whom we are sent, that the Father's healing love and mercy may truly make a difference in the world. Love, *Jack Hill*

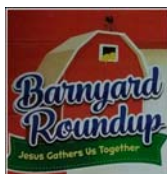
