CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: THE HOLY TRINITY

Having completed the season of Easter with the celebration of Pentecost, we now return to Ordinary Time, at least during the week. This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity and thank God for revealing himself to us out of love. It is the nature of the lover to want to be known and to reveal himself or herself to the beloved, and we celebrate today another expression of God's great love for us – God's self-revelation to us his beloved children.

Today we welcome Fr. Thomas R. Carroll, Sch.P., from the Piarist Fathers who will give the annual Mission Appeal from the Propagation of the Faith. We described their ministry in last week's bulletin, and this Sunday, Fr. Thomas Carroll will give a more personal description of their ministry.

As we celebrated the Solemnity of Our Lord's Ascension and Pentecost, we were reminded that **we are a Church being sent out on mission**, to share the love and mercy of God beyond our parish campus. It made me feel good as I wrote this to recall how this month we are doing this on three different levels:

First, with the Mighty Moms we have been collecting peanut butter and other summer foods for the needy children of Livingston Parish. They will be distributing food for their "Full Tummy Project" in French Settlement, the first week of June. May 30 will be their last day to collect for this distribution, but they welcome contributions of food in their barrels through the year.

Second, with the Piarist Fathers, we will be reaching out this Sunday, beyond the boundaries of our State to assist their ministry to the poorest of the poor in the Appalachian region of Eastern Kentucky.

Thirdly, with Young Adults, we have reached out this month via donations and the big box in the church foyer to assist them in their ministry in Honduras.

The Mighty Moms, the Piarist Fathers and Young Adults all do great work, and it is good for us to know that we, too, are a loving and dedicated part of their ministries.

As we neared the end of the Easter Season, we were happy to host the Altar Servers at the rectory for ice-



cream and cookies. Deacon Rudy had an "update meeting" with present servers and welcomed new servers to the ministry. After, we were able to gather at the rectory. We thank our servers for their ministry, and Deacon Rudy and the adults who assist him.

June 1 we will be happy to welcome Seminarian Joseph Bergan to the parish. Earlier this spring we gathered with other priests and seminarians, and I was able to present him with the "Keys of the Kingdom," a fob which will help him move from church to rectory, to the administration building and other



buildings on campus. He will be introducing himself to parishioners at the Sunday Liturgies as we move through June, working with Barbara Normand and Summer Vacation Bible School, and taking part in many of the parish ministries, meetings, etc. in the course of the coming weeks. The goal of his weeks with us is to give him the opportunity to experience parish life from a different vantage point than he has already experienced.

This Sunday I am scheduled to concelebrate and preach at the 11:30 Eucharist at St. Andrew's Parish Church in Dublin. I have celebrated Eucharist and said a few words there before as it is the parish where my great-grandfather, Joseph O'Connor, was baptized, and where his parents, James Power and Frances O'Connor were married. It was only a few years later in 1832 that they sailed to New Orleans. The parish has always been very kind and welcoming. Just a bit of history: In Ireland, in the Penal Days, prior to 1750, Catholics were not allowed to own property, build churches, or worship publicly. The parish of St. Andrew's existed, but worshiped on Sunday in a barn which had been given for their use. One Sunday in 1750, a high chimney next door collapsed during a storm and fell on the barn, killing several and injuring many. After this, there was an uprising and officials acknowledged laws needed changing. They were allowed to build a church, but it couldn't be on a street, but had to be behind other buildings, out of sight. This was the church my ancestors celebrated the sacraments in. The present St. Andrew's was dedicated in 1834, the largest and first Catholic Church to be built facing the street in Dublin since Penal Days began. I will remember you in prayer as I celebrate the Eucharist there.

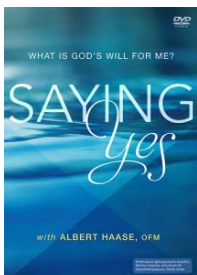

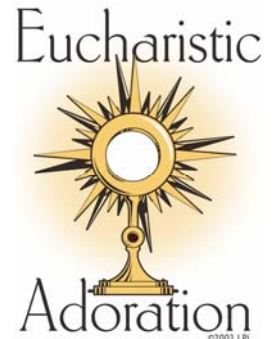
