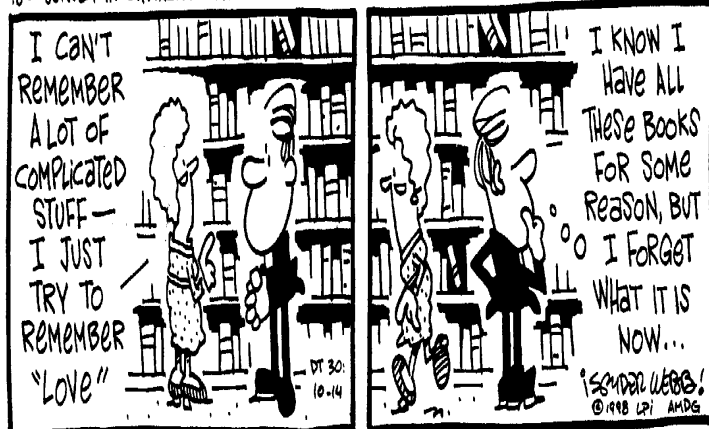

As we move through these days of summer, the Scriptures this Sunday remind us that God’s law of love is written in our hearts, that all we need do is listen to our hearts to carry it out. Let us keep one another and all who journey with us in prayer. Love,

Why don't Christians follow all the Jewish Laws in the Old Testament?



Many of the Jewish laws were ethical in nature, that is: telling us how to relate to God and how to treat other people, such as the Ten Commandments. Others were ritual laws meant to regulate how Jewish worship, sacrifices and various feasts were to be conducted. Many of these ethical laws Jesus actually expanded (the 5th and 6th commandments), others like keeping holy the Sabbath, Jesus seemed less concerned about. Sins against the commandments, thou shalt not kill or commit adultery, began long before an actual act is committed. Early Christians replaced circumcision with baptism as our mark of Christianity and chose to honor God on the first day of the week, the day of his resurrection.
