## CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME PASSION

**The Gospel today speaks of a shepherd, a woman, and a father.** They all share something in common – PASSION.

We have become quite familiar with “mission statements” which are written by institutions, both secular and religious. These statements proclaim the purpose of the institution, what they are about, what they’re supposed to do. I remember so well my first months here when Leadership and Pastoral Council were working on our Parish Mission Statement. We wrote, prayed, changed words, until finally we reached a unanimous consensus that this is what we were to be about. We then invited parishioners to sign the statement. We began with the Confirmation Class who signed it after their Confirmation, then we brought it to the church and mission for several weeks inviting parishioners to sign it. The mat grew with the passing weeks until finally we framed it and placed it in the Administration Building Foyer. Happily it was saved from the waters as it was removed from the Administration Building and cleaned the day after the flood, as soon as we could get in.

But all of us know that those who fulfill that mission can do so in a variety of ways, with a variety of motivations. For instance, we are familiar with the person in customer service or the teacher in the classroom who fulfills his or her task adequately, perhaps even well. But we also know that when the person in customer service or in the classroom carries out their mission with a personal passion and even with joy, it makes all the difference in the world to us the recipients.

In his first letter to Timothy today Paul unveils for us what we might refer to as Jesus’ mission statement: “Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.” This is the purpose of his life, his reason for taking on our human flesh and living our life, the reason for his life’s work and, most especially, his death and resurrection – to save sinners! But just in case we might not fully recognize the disposition of his heart and the heart of his Father, in the carrying out of his mission, the parables presented in the gospel today answer that question.

Each parable, in its own way, reveals the very heart of God, the passion of God seen in Jesus and directed toward sinners. The diligent searching of the shepherd for the lost sheep, the relentless looking of the woman for the lost coin find their greatest expression in the rejoicing that takes place at their finding. This passionate searching and above all the rejoicing—this, Jesus says, is the passion and the rejoicing in the heart of his Father in regard to sinners. And as if to leave no doubt in our minds, the eloquent Parable of the Prodigal



Son reveals the one who saves sinners, who waits patiently and rejoices at the return of those who have gone astray.

The scriptures invite us to imagine that we are the object of God’s search that we are the recipients of the gaze of that love such as we picture on the face of the father in the parable. We are invited to embrace the truth that we are the source of God’s joy, the cause of that joy, when we allow ourselves to be found. What is it like for us to enter into that imaginative process? What do we feel and think as we allow ourselves to be in that gaze? The answer to those questions makes all the difference in the world!

We have the Mission Statement on the cover of every bulletin as a reminder of who we are and what we are about. Let us pray that we may always live that statement **with passion**.

By August 31, most of the buildings on campus had been gutted, cleaned, purified, and were ready for rebuilding. The Total Staff had our first meeting since the flood and I was able to pass out a little floor plan of the office space and administration building for them to look at and offer comments. The Diocese and both of our insurance carriers had approved Belfor Property Restoration from Mobile as our contractor. They had done a good job for St. Alphonsus Parish and were well known and well-spoken of by both of our insurance carriers. There will be few changes to the footprint of the buildings, mostly a few changes that assist our work in the office flow a bit more efficiently. By the time you receive this, I hope to have met with Finance and Pastoral Councils and though nothing is official, I hope by the time you read this, we have something in place.

Labor Day takes on a special meaning this year. I thank you for the prayerful support you have offered each other and us these weeks. It has made a real difference. Some of those who have come from out of the Diocese and state to serve meals and offer assistance said they would like to come back when all is repaired and we are back in the buildings on campus and cook a welcome back supper for us. This would really be fantastic.

Let us keep one another in prayer as we continue through these months of rebuilding. Love,

## The Grieving Process After the "Great Flood of 2016"

A week or so ago in the bulletin was an article about trauma and what to expect in the aftermath. The article alluded to the fact that we all need to grieve for our losses whether that be our homes, jobs, schools, or loss of a way of life. We have all experienced a change in our lives from long term houseguest to increased travel time to empty grocery selves (this is getting better). To get through this time healthy we need to grieve for our losses.

The first stage of grieving is the numbness, confusion, anxiety that comes right after the event. This phase is over fast but lets you get done what needs to be done. Some of these feelings may resurface upon seeing the destruction first hand or on the TV. Sometimes it may seem like it is all a dream.

After that comes the "honeymoon" phase. This can last from one week to six months. The community comes together to share experiences and to help one another. The government and support agencies are still involved in providing help, and assistance with clean-up.

Now the hard work starts. The next phase is "confrontation or disillusionment phase". This phase last from two months to two years. It is hard work because grieving is work. While not physically taxing there is a lot of mental work and readjustment to be done. This is where a person comes to terms and adjusts to the changes in their lives. Remember that feeling like "you are going crazy", out of control feelings, irritability and confusion, like grieving are all normal responses to an abnormal situation.

Think of trauma as a "wound". For a wound to heal a person needs to get extra sleep, have good nutrition and exercise-even if it is just moving your hands and legs.

My biggest fear for our parishioners is that some will think that none of this applies to them because they did not lose anything. Remember that this trauma happened to ALL of us and we ALL have to work through this grieving process.
