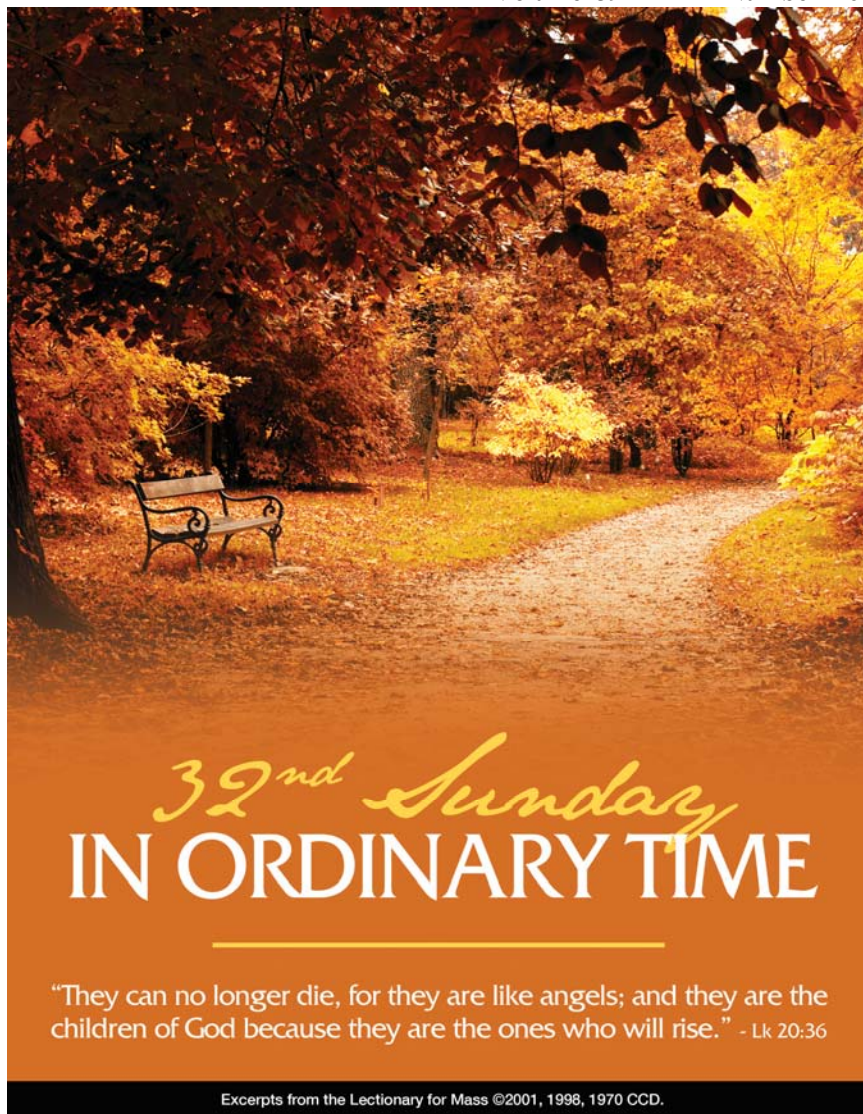

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME THANKS

The Scriptures this Sunday have St. Paul praying for us that, “Our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace [undeserved gifts], may encourage our hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word.” What wonderful words and what a wonderful prayer for us all as we continue through this month of thanksgiving.

We began the month with the celebration of All Saints Day, giving thanks for those who have been a part of our journey through the years, those who have encouraged us through the witness of their lives and shared with us their love, prayer and concern. We continue through the month with reason for gratitude.

This Tuesday, November 8th, is personally a special day of thanksgiving for me as it marks the date I was installed in my first pastorate as pastor of St. Mary of False River in New Roads. This year is especially special as it marks the 40th Anniversary of my assignment and installation in New Roads. It is hard to believe that I first became pastor forty years ago, and how much has happened in these forty years – in New Roads, at the Cathedral, on the River Road and now in Denham Springs. 

It is important to reflect on internal issues now that they don’t catch up with us unaware later on. Darryl Ducote, from the Diocesan Office of Family Life, will offer to the parish an excellent presentation on November 9, at 6:30 p.m. in the Main Hall. It will be the first opportunity for many to see the progress that has been made in the Administration Building, hopefully a reflection of the progress we have made as individuals and families both internally and externally.

Continuing with our physical rebuilding on the parish campus, we have progress and good news to report. We recently received word that the blinds for the parish offices, coffee room and small hall would be installed on November 14, and that there is a good chance we may be able to move back into the offices Thanksgiving week. We also received an update from the pew company that they will arrive to repair the pews sometime between November 21 and December 16.

Looking ahead, we hope to have the Adoration Chapel finished in early December. Besides restoring the chapel, there is obviously the need to restore our list of Committed Adorers. Some have moved, temporarily or permanently, and others, for some reason or another, may not find it possible to resume their commitments. 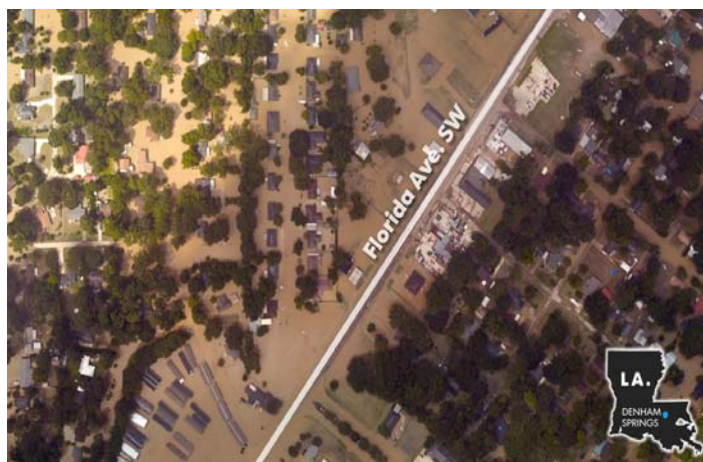

From Flooding to Flourishing

Let's face it—the last few months have been so stressful for everyone. So many are dealing with flooded houses, workplaces, schools, churches and that is just the start of the list. Even if your house did not flood chances are you have a family member or friend that did. The traffic is worse, some businesses we frequent are closed. The Great Flood of 2016 has affected us all!

Disasters can affect us physically and mentally also. Usually that is far down on the list of things to worry about but in fact being healthy physically, mentally and spiritually will help those other things on the list get done faster. Not taking care of ourselves can often result in Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome.

On November 9, 2016, at 6:30 in the Main Hall, there will be a presentation called “From Flooding to Flourishing”. The speakers for this event are Darryl Ducote from the Diocesan Office of Family Life and a social worker from Catholic Charities. They will deal with how to turn this traumatic experience into Traumatic Growth. The advice they give can help give you the information needed to truly live healthy, physically, mentally and spiritually. Remember even if your house did not flood, this event happened to EVERYONE. The advice they give can be useful in many aspects of our lives. This event is free and opened to everyone.
