CARE OF THE SICK: Emergency calls answered immediately. Home visitation for the sick and shut-in weekly and upon request. Hospital visits weekly and upon request.



Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Awaiting Fulfillment

This Sunday as we begin the Third Week of Advent, the



prophet Isaiah uses the term return

- "Those whom the Lord has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing." Isaiah offers us an invitation, one that is offered to us in a particularly meaningful way now in Advent. The reading uses language of "return," so to me this

is an invitation to come home, to return to where God desires us to be.

Where is this? It's a place of wholeness, where our afflictions are healed. It is a place where life and energy and beauty abound. It is a place of harmony and unity, where the causes of fear and mistrust are removed. This is where our invitation calls us.

The implication, of course, is that if we are returning somewhere, we have been someplace else. Perhaps, in the language of Isaiah, we have been feeble, weak, or frightened, blind or deaf. Perhaps we have been thirsty in a spiritual or emotional desert. Maybe we have been foolish and gone astray in how we treat the people in our lives, how we choose to spend our time, or in our general attitude about life. We all have a journey to make this Advent; we all have a holy way to travel as we seek to return home to the way of living and being that God desires for us. How can I work toward healing for myself, for someone else, or in a particular relationship? What areas of my life need a fresh dose of life, energy, and beauty? How can I contribute to harmony and unity in my family and my community? How can I return?

The gospel shows us how Jesus is present to make it happen. Our road, our holy way of returning to God is a way of action, choosing to take steps in our lives that lead to healing, abundant life, and unity. What are those steps for us? What holy way are we being invited to travel this Advent?

The blind, deaf, lame, and mute are mentioned in the Scriptures. This is how Isaiah in our first reading; the psalmist in our responsorial psalm; and Matthew in the Gospel describe life without God. Nearly lifeless, it would seem! All these words imply being cut off in some way, longing for a connection. When one avenue of communication is unavailable, we try to find different ways to connect when it matters.

If I couldn't see, I may not know where I am in relation to the world, or to others. I may not be able to read facial expressions or body language as part of communicating with someone. I may not be able to share a sight, a vision, with someone else. ("Do you see what I see?" "Well... no.")

Light would not touch me through my senses. Figuratively speaking, I might be closed in on myself and my own perceptions, unable to acknowledge the presence of another. I would need to seek other ways to communicate.

If I couldn't hear, my world might be silent but for my own thoughts. I may not be able to understand the tone or inflection of another's words. I may not be able to acknowledge someone trying to reach me, even if they are shouting as loud as they can. I may not initially be able to receive the message someone wants to give me.

If I couldn't move, I might be unable to walk with someone. I may observe their experiences, but not share the same experience with them. I may be dependent on others for basic care. I may not be able to express myself through movement. I may not feel free, but rather captive and confined.

If I couldn't speak, it would be a challenge to share my thoughts and feelings with others. I may not participate in communal cheers or songs. I may feel as though no one acknowledges or values me, since I cannot speak up for myself. I may not be able to respond when asked a question, or when called.

Dark, silent, and still: a world defined by absence. Isaiah, the psalmist, and Jesus say that with God, our world is defined by presence. Where there was dryness, abundant life! Where there was blindness, light and vision! Where there was deafness, understanding and relationship! Where there was paralysis and captivity, dancing and leaping in freedom! Where there was not even speech, singing in joyful response!

James reminds us in the second reading that such joy is worth waiting for. We are still in the midst of Advent, the season of waiting, of preparing in joyful anticipation. The rose candle today is a reminder of the first rays of dawn. In the meantime, before the sun is up, we are called to "make our hearts firm" in order to walk with God through the desert, and to work with God in the fields that will bear fruit.

Many thanks to those who returned the (re)Commitment to Stewardship of Prayer cards as we began the Advent season. It was a really good response and we remind you that the commitment brochures remain in the rear of the church and you can still fill it out and drop it into the collection.

We received good news as we began the month of December. The pew parts are supposed to arrive on Monday, the 12th. Let us pray for each other as we all seek to return in one way or another to where we know we are whole, where God wishes us to be. Love,

On December 9, 1531, Our Lady appeared to a simple Aztec Indian who had converted to the Catholic faith, Juan Diego. Three days later, at Juan Diego's request, Mary provided a sign so the local bishop would believe that she actually had appeared. Roses grew out of the cold winter soil, and when Juan Diego opened his cloak to show the bishop what he had found, an image of Our Lady appeared on the fabric. These occurrences led to the conversion of most of Mexico and remain today a strong sign of Our Lady's concern and love for us. The Feast Day of Our Lady of Guadeloupe is December 12.

Church-approved Marian apparitions always point to her Son, Jesus. For many of us with a strong Marian devotion, Mary is a pathway into a stronger relationship with our Lord. Her generosity shown to Juan Diego is the same generosity shown to each of us that choose to ask her intercession. Families pray for one another and she is a very prominent member of our family. May the miracle of Our Lady of Guadeloupe be a sign of warmth for you in the cold of winter and of Advent hope for a Christ Child that has redeemed the world.
