Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time

This Sunday as we hear the Lord reminding us that we are called to be salt and light, and then he reminds us that salt is of no use if it loses its taste. It is through our prayer commitments that we keep that taste alive and well in our hearts and lives. I thank you for your commitment to prayer and for the (re)commitment to Stewardship of Finance which you make this Sunday. All of our stewardship comes together in a beautiful way to help us further the Kingdom of God in our world today.

Later this month before we enter the Lenten Season, we will have the pleasure of welcoming Fr. Philip Chircop to the parish for a "Pre Lenten Parish Mission."



Fr. Philip is a Jesuit priest from the Mediterranean Island of Malta. He is an artist at heart and loves all things beautiful and soulful. As he states, he strongly believes that "beauty is a uniquely wonderful entry into the mystery of the God whose presence is everywhere and whose circumference is nowhere. God can indeed be tasted and seen all around us if we are patient enough to look long and longingly. Fr. Philip

gave the priests of the Diocese our annual retreat two years ago, and we found it so good, that within days of the retreat, I had contacted him about coming here for a parish mission. Fr. Philip considers himself a seeker with bottomless curiosity, always looking for fresh and creative ways to proclaim the Good News in the hope of inspiring fellow pilgrims to embrace real and radical changes leading to transformation. He will be giving the annual retreat to the priests of the Archdiocese of New Orleans this month and will join us afterwards.

The theme of our mission will be: GO BUILD MY CHURCH, Becoming a living stone in the body of Christ.

Church is more than a building and a structure. Church is more than an organization. Church is more than an institution. Church is a movement, a flow and a calling. We are the people of God, the Body of Christ, a communion of broken people, blessed and called out to serve and heal the world we live in. Called by name and graced with a variety of talents and gifts, we are all uniquely called and challenged to journey daily the path of conversion allowing ourselves to be transformed into vibrant, living stones, dancing to the heartbeat of God. **Fr. Philip will preach at all Sunday Liturgies February 18 and 19, and then offer Mission presentations Monday- Wednesday at 7:00 p.m.**

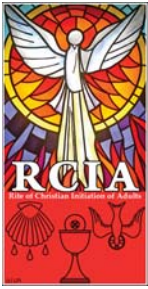


graphed as the organ was played in the church for the first time last week. I received an email within a week or two after the flood from the parish telling us that they were purchas-

We trust this organ will be a blessing to the parish for many years to come, and we thank the Episcopal Church in Starkville for this wonderful act of generosity and kindness.

Recognizing God in your Ordinary Moments



I recently watched the film adaptation of "Godspell" with my teenage daughter. I had such fond memories of watching it when I was young, back in the day. I listened to the soundtrack so many times and learned to play many of the songs on my guitar. The exclamation from the show, "You are the light of the world!" has always been firmly planted in my mind. After about ten minutes, my daughter looked at me with that look only a teenage girl can display.

"What is this?" she asked with a certain level of condescension. Yes, the film did not hold up so well in the eyes of the twenty-first-century critic. So we laughed most of the way through it. What attracted me to the film and the soundtrack in the first place wasn't Jesus in a Superman shirt or the idea of the apostles wondering around the urban jungle. I was attracted to the message. I was attracted to that assertion in the song, "You are the light of the world."

There will always be people who see the Gospel of Jesus Christ as dated, irrelevant, and even hokey. You and I are called to be the light of the world? Good stewards must never shy away from living lives that truly bear witness to the reality of the Gospel. The parables of Jesus have as much meaning for us today as ever. Look around. The world we live in needs a little light for sure.
