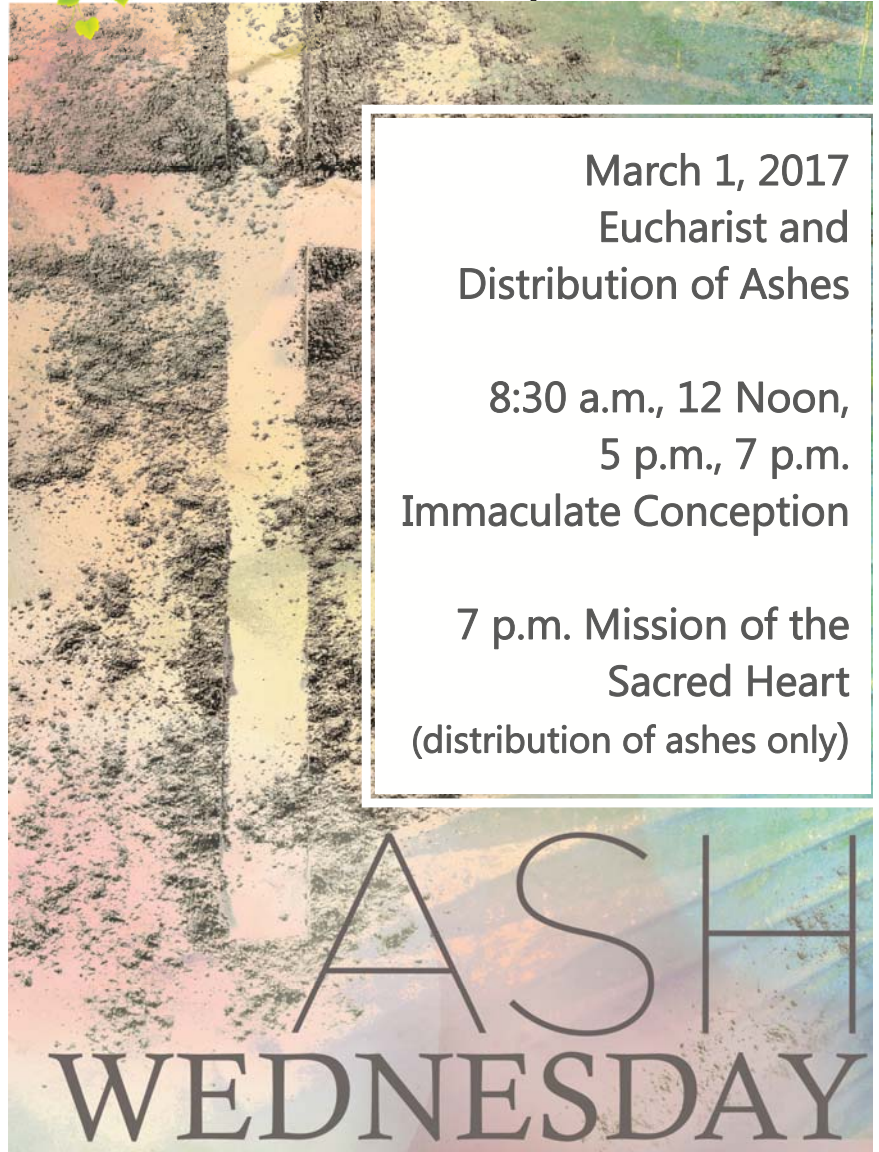

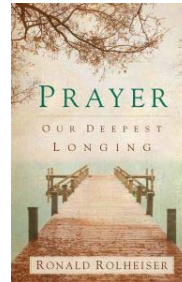

**Preparing the Lenten packets for mailing was no small task.** A team of twenty volunteers placed labels on envelopes,



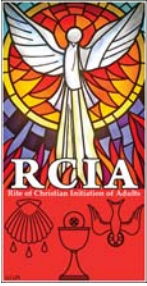

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

What is the RCIA Rite of Election? This Rite marks a key moment. The catechumens travel to the Cathedral where the community, with godparents representing the parish, will wholeheartedly acclaim the participants' readiness. It is appropriate for the bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the life of the Church. The godparents' role is very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make serious statements about the catechumens. The decision of an RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgement and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "Elect". They have been chosen to enter into the final period of preparation for initiation, and called by the bishop, their shepherd, to the holy mysteries to be celebrated at Easter.

What is the RCIA Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion? For those already baptized (candidates), the reality of being chosen and claimed by Christ took place at their Baptism; they are already among the elect in Christ. They are "called to continuing conversion," and thus their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist is recognized. With their sponsors standing in support of them, the candidates are addressed by the bishop to hear the Lord's call to conversion, and together with the Elect are moved into a period of intense spiritual preparation.

### Fast & Abstinence during the Lenten Season

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to observe the particular law of their own *sui iuris* Church.

#### A Reflection on Lenten Fasting

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. There are three areas we should look at in our observance of Lent. **Sacrifice** (giving up something), **almsgiving**, (being more generous with time, talent and resources) and **prayer** (adding an extra prayer to our daily routine). We really should try to do something in each area. Giving up something we like is great training for when we are asked to say no to something that is wrong or would hurt us or someone else. Taking time to be a little more generous with your time especially with someone you may not like, will make a dramatic difference in your relationship. Add an extra minute of prayer to your daily routine, put it on your calendar or scheduler. Careful...it may become a habit. The absolute best thing you can do is attend an extra weekday Mass. During Lent we offer a 6:00 PM Mass each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. If you ever wanted to spend a quiet Mass with just you and God and minimal distractions, this is your perfect opportunity.
