





Consideration of our Christian Commitment: A Lenten Journey

This Sunday's Gospel is the story of Jesus and the woman at the well, a story with which we are all familiar, but can always be seen in new and graced ways.

Both the first and the second reading today point to the gospel reading and help us do that – see the familiar Gospel story in new and different ways. In the first reading the people's longing for water prepares us to hear the Samaritan woman's longing for water that would spare her the need to keep returning to the well every day.

In the second reading Paul's words while we were still sinners provide a setting for Jesus' engaging the woman in conversation while she was still a sinner. This leads us to the Gospel which offers us several lessons, but I will focus only on two of them in this article (and save other ones for the homily ①).

The first lesson is that sin can blind us to the recognition of our sins. The woman seems to have gone about her daily chores oblivious of the moral predicament of her life, yet perhaps not so totally oblivious. Women in that region went to draw water in the cool of the morning, yet here she is, coming to draw water *about noon* in the heat of the day. Was she avoiding the gossip of other women coming to the same well? Regardless, her conversation with Jesus reveals no awareness of her morally wrong situation. Sin can blind us and this can happen also to good people. Sin can blind us.

The second lesson comes from the town folks, who first come to Jesus after hearing the woman's story of her encounter with him. They invited Jesus to stay with them and he indeed stayed there two days. Their interaction with him during those days led them to say to the woman: we no longer believe because of your word, for we have heard for ourselves... We ourselves may have been led to the Lord initially by someone else's words and this can be a promising beginning. But in the last analysis our believing will need to rest on a personal experience of the Lord. We have today an abundance –superabundance? – of words about Jesus. What we need, more than words, is the testimony of believers, who know the Lord from more than just hearsay. May the good God help us do this from the loving ministries, words and actions that spring from our hearts.

Our Lady of the Lake Hospital recently informed us that they have recently migrated to a new electronic medical record system. This new system unfortunately does not have the capability to fax, and they will no longer be able to send notices to parishes when their parishioners are patients in Our Lady of the Lake. Parishioners will now have to let the parish office know directly that their loved ones are in the hospital. This has been the case in all other hospitals which serve our parishioners. I just thought this would be a good time to call this to your attention.

This Sunday afternoon from 1:00 till 4:00 St. George Parish is having an "open house" to give all an



opportunity to view their new church, ask questions, and have some of the meaning behind the construction explained. There is no Eucharist or Prayer Service associated with this, it is simply an open house called "Lift the Veil." I have not seen the interior since its completion, but did see it a few months ago, and it was already very impressive then. I think you would enjoy the visit.

I moved back into the rectory Ash Wednesday and did it ever feel good. Not everything was finished, but I had a bed, running water and air conditioning. Traveling to and from Baton Rouge these seven months, I didn't really have time to walk in the mornings, but since Ash Wednesday, I have been able to put my three miles in and get a bit more back to normal. As I write this, Fr. Raj is in the process of moving back. We are still waiting on a few things to be completed and/or delivered, but it is no problem – gives us something more to look forward to.

While we have the Light Is On for You every Wednesday in Lent, St. Aloysius on Stuart Ave. in Baton Rouge will have something special going on Friday, March 31. Called 24 HOURS FOR THE LORD, it will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Reconciliation ministered by priests of the Diocese which will begin at 9:00 a.m. Friday, March 31, and continue until 8:00 a.m. Saturday, April 1. It will also include Stations of the Cross, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Liturgy of the Hours, Praise and Worship and other devotionals during the 24 Hours. Snacks, Coffee, Water and Security will be provided.

Let us keep one another in prayer that we may all grow as good witnesses to the Lord's loving and forgiving presence among us. Love,

RCIA-THE RITES OF SCRUTINY

The Third Phase of the Catechumenate...Purification and Enlightenment, ordinarily coincides with the Lenten season, which is a time of reconciliation, prayer and spiritual renewal for the whole Church. The Elect are introduced to various prayer forms and engage in Lenten practices. Since the Church

emphasizes conversion during Lent, this is an appropriate time for those who are already baptized to receive the sacrament of reconciliation.

This Third Sunday of Lent, we, the assembly, celebrate with our Elect the first of three Rites of Scrutiny which includes prayers for the strength to be faithful to the gospel and deliverance from evil. The Elect will bow in humility as the priest and our community pray for them. The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the elects' hearts and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong and good. Three Scrutinies are celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, after the Homily. The Scripture readings for the Scrutinies come from Cycle A of the Lectionary: the Gospel story of the Samaritan woman at the well for the 1st Scrutiny, the Gospel story of the healing of the man born blind for the 2nd Scrutiny, and the Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus for the 3rd Scrutiny. The celebrations of the Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on our own sins and the need for God's help.



Recognizing God in your Ordinary Moments



When I think about the story of the Samaritan woman at the well, I think of my father. This Gospel reading that we use every year for the First Scrutiny of the RCIA was always my favorite to discuss with those

who would be baptized in just a few weeks at the Easter Vigil. Not that many years ago, my father was one of those elect. That year, the story was more powerful than ever.

The woman went frequently to the well looking to get the water that would sustain her body. But in the story, Jesus tells her of a different kind of water, one that gives life and quenches even the driest of thirsts. The story tells us that she put down her water jar and ran to the town telling of her encounter with the One who may be the Christ. She left that jar at the well. She did not need it anymore.

I encounter people all the time that spend their days going up the hill to draw water. They are tired and spent. My father was one of those. But with the gift of baptismal water, that constant chore is now over. There is no need to travel up that hill.

This Lent, if you are one of the baptized, reclaim the gift of your baptism. Stop climbing that hill in search of something that can only quench your thirst temporarily. You encountered Christ and have the everlasting, living water already. Put down that water jar. Your new life has only just begun.
