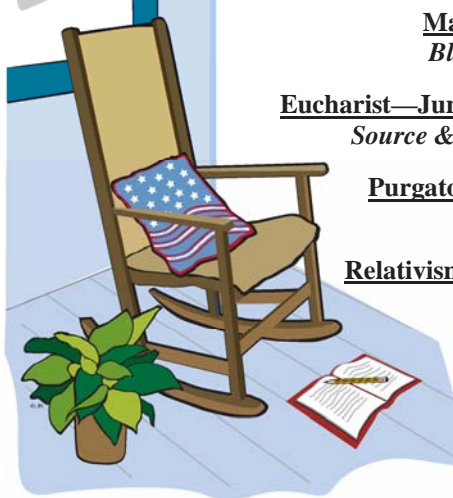

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: An Easter People

As we gather this Sixth Sunday of Easter, we also remember St. Eugene de Mazenod who was the founder of the Oblates, the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. St. Eugene was born of a noble and wealthy family, and at the time he was growing in adulthood as a young man, the French Revolution caused the family to lose much of what they had, especially their noble titles. He went to Italy with his father where he met a priest who was a spiritual guide to him. When he returned to France, he entered the seminary, was ordained, and soon after his ordination, began to gather around him many who shared his views on ministry to the poorest of the poor, ministry to those most in need. He soon had such a good and dedicated group ministering with him, he went to Rome and the Pope approved the order and gave



it the name it has to this day. He later became Bishop of Marseilles, and in time, the senior Bishop in France. In his later years he suffered with cancer, but continued to inspire many. In the 1800's, the Oblates traveled to San Antonio where they continued to minister to the Indians and Mexicans, those most in need of their ministry. In 1918, a few went to New Orleans and began conferring with the Archbishop and on May 12, 1919, the Archbishop assigned them to ministry in Livingston Parish. There were a number of mission stations in Livingston where they served, such as Denham Springs, but in the early years, they lived in Albany and traveled their missionary routes through the parish. They were serving here in 1960 when Immaculate Conception became a parish. In 1983, when things began to really grow here in the parish, they left, that they might find other, poor, small communities to serve. They had done their job so well, they felt they would be more faithful to their mission elsewhere. **What a wonderful day to celebrate The Grill Is On for You, as we remember St. Eugene and those he inspired to follow him here.** Above is the cross which he was given when he professed his vows in the order which he founded. It is a real treasure for the Oblates. I spent time with them when I was in France a few years ago, and they gave it to me to pray with for a while when I was there. It will be good being with you all today.



The Fall Festival Committee had its first meeting in April to begin planning for the Fall Festival which will be held October 27, 28 and 29. It was a good meeting, and a lot of good plans were discussed. Among possibly new plans for this October is the idea of having a "Draw Down"



dinner dance for all those who purchased tickets for the \$10,000 raffle. At this time we might also have the auction which has been a part of the Festival on Sunday afternoons. The rides are booked, and though many of the games were destroyed during the flood, we hope to be able to both build and borrow some to take their places. The main idea running through the meeting was that if we cannot do everything, try to see what has worked best through the years and grow from this. Other thoughts discussed was the possibility of a Talent Show on Saturday morning, beer served under the pavilion, and inviting St. Francis Episcopal for their pumpkin patch. It was a good meeting and the next meeting was scheduled for May 10.

The Annual May Crowning was celebrated at the First Sunday Eucharist in May. As parishioners gathered



May 6 for the Anticipated Eucharist, Kristin Taylor crowned the statue to Mary. She and her husband Blake are expecting the birth of another child this year. We have traditionally asked the family expecting the birth of a child to crown the Blessed Mother. We pray with Mary for one another. Love,

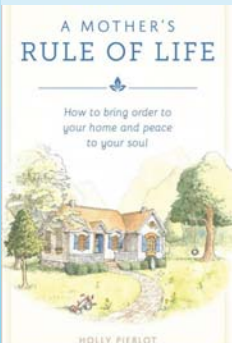
