Question of the Week

John 6:51-58-Jesus uses the metaphor "living bread" in reference to himself. What makes this such a powerful metaphor in today's reading?

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

As we gather on this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (known earlier as Corpus Christi), we gather in a spirit of gratitude for the gift Jesus gave at the Last Supper, the night before he died.

I thought today would be a good day to share with you a nice story which centers on the Adoration Chapel.

Persons entering the chapel for Adoration may notice the statue of a kneeling angel which the statue of St. Michael the Archangel formerly stood. After the flood as things were salvaged from the chapel, the statue of St. Michael suffered broken wings and the loss of the pedestal. In time the wings were glued back together, but not glued in place, simply placed there. I was able to find a new pedestal for the statue, and before we reopened the chapel, I was able to place the pedestal in place and then was bringing the statue back to the Chapel. Well, the newly repaired wings fell out and when I horridly reached to catch them, the statue fell again, lost its head, hands and of course, the wings again. So the statue was back in the repair mode. But what happened is that we had a pedestal and no statue. That's when I remembered a very special statue which has special significance to us here at Immaculate Conception.



Back in 1853 when the present St. Joseph (now Cathedral) was constructed in downtown Baton Rouge, there was a beautiful wooden altar in the sanctuary flanked by two kneeling angels with lights. It was from this altar priests in the early 1900's were offering the Eucharist and then traveling here to Denham Springs to celebrate Eucharist in homes, then railroad cars, and then finally in the new chapel on Range Avenue built in 1917. I have photographs of the altar

from an earlier book I had written on the Catholic Church in Baton Rouge which shows the angels. When in 1923, St. Joseph's was remodeled and got the white marble altar, the old wooden altar was given to Sacred Heart Parish and later when Sacred Heart got its present church, the altar was given to Our Lady of Mercy. When Our Lady of Mercy built its new church, the old altar was burned as they felt it would never be used again. However, the angels were saved. There was a certain lady in Baton Rouge who had them and when I was at the Cathedral heard about them. She lent them to us to help decorate a St. Joseph Altar the Polozola family and their friends were building for the Cathedral

Parish. I was told that they came from the old St. Joseph Church altar. Later, when I moved from the Cathedral, I never heard of the angels again until a few months ago.

Tony Pitslata came to see me and told me of an angel which his parents, Mary and Tony Pitslata, had purchased about 20 years ago from a lady in Baton Rouge. He described her and the angel and asked if we would like it in memory of his mother and father. When he describe the lady and the angel, I knew it was the same lady and angel I had come to know from my Cathedral days. So he brought us the angel. I wasn't sure where to put it, but when St. Michael tumbled, it knew where the kneeling angel belonged.

To me it seemed so appropriate that this angel one hundred years ago in 1917 was on the side of the altar where a priest may have been celebrating an early Eucharist before coming here to Denham Springs to celebrate with us on Range Avenue. The angel seemed to be a beautiful connection with our roots as a mission served by priests from Baton Rouge as the Oblates weren't assigned to Livingston Parish until May 12, 1919.

So the angel is now kneeling in the Adoration Chapel, facing the Blessed Sacrament, calling our attention to the wonderful gift Jesus left us the night before he died. We thank our good God for the wonderful gift and for the priests who traveled to us with it in our early days. May this angel be a reminder to us all of the gift only God could give us and the generous priests who traveled to serve our needs.

As you read this, I am with family in Germany showing



them the beautiful small town of Wiedenbrück where our family lived before leaving Germany for New Orleans in 1845. At left is the house they lived in. It has a plaque and is on the National Register of

Germany, not because of my family, but because it is such an old house going back many generations.

I hope to unite with you in Wiedenbrück and Denham Springs as we gather today around the one altar and share the one bread and the one cup, and are nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ. **Happy Father's Day** to all our Father role models. Love,

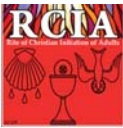

WHY DO WE CALL OUR PRIESTS "FATHER"?



Doesn't Jesus say "Call no one on earth your father, you have but one father in heaven" (Matthew 23:9). First of all, if we are to take Jesus' statement literally, then we are all blaspheming when we refer to our biological parent as "father". Secondly, Jesus himself uses the term father to refer to other human beings. (Lk 11:11, Lk 12:53, Mt 19:19) St. Paul calls Abraham "father". (Rm 4:12) and sees himself as the spiritual father of those he has evangelized. (1 Cor 4:15-17). The word father appears 311 times in the New Testament.

What does a father do for us? He gives us life, feeds us, protects us, teaches us, disciplines us, guides us and leads us, just to name a few. Our earthly fathers are all of these things in the physical world. Our priests do these same things for us spiritually. They give us new life in baptism, feed us with the Eucharist; they teach us, guide us and lead us through this life into the Promised Land. Jesus is trying to tell us that we have one heavenly Father who does all these things for us perfectly because He is the perfection of love. Everyone else earns the title "father" only in so far as he imitates our heavenly Father.
