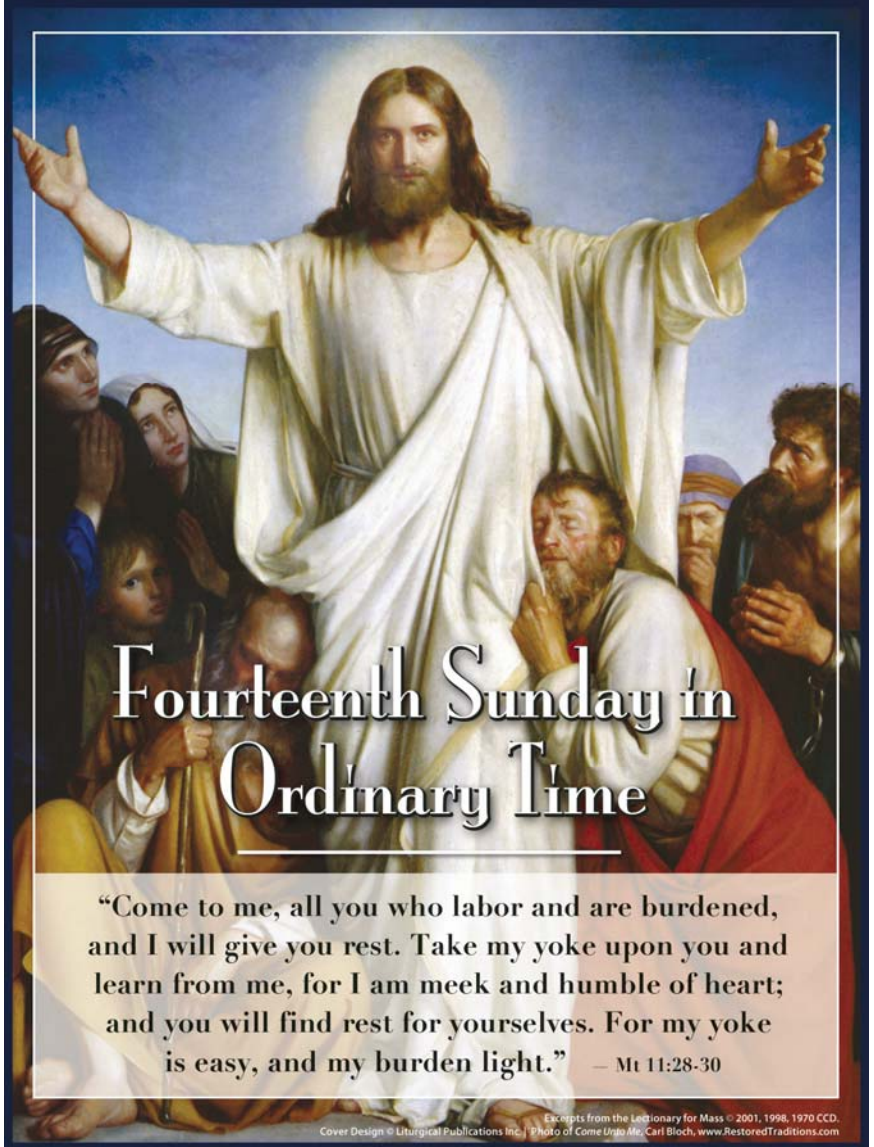

## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Preparation

As we celebrate this Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Gospel this Sunday seems to describe in a lot of ways our summer months. In the Gospel this Sunday Jesus says “Come to me...and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me.” Toward the end of June most of our regular parish programs and ministries are taking a break because many are on vacation, but at the same time, many preparations are being made as we prepare for another year of parish life and ministry. Jesus is inviting us to find rest and renewal, and prepare to resume our ministries and other programs in August.

One of our central ministries in the life of the parish is our RCIA. Our RCIA Team had its initial meeting



the last Monday in June to make plans for the coming year and to schedule talks and other aspects of the RCIA process. There was a really good turnout, especially considering it was the night of the L.S.U. game. Over 30 persons attended and there were seven new team members. They discussed the format and reviewed the evaluations of last year's



neophytes. Photographed during the meeting were Tammy Jackson, Amanda Collins and Deacon George. While none are new to the RCIA journey, this will be Tammy's first year as Coordinator and Deacon George's first year with us.

The young members of our parish family had the opportunity to come together for Summer Vacation Bible School. The theme was Treasure God's Love, and in a lot of ways Vacation Bible School was a preparation for our Parish School of Religion which begins on September 11. During the year students will learn more and more about God's love and the many ways in which God shares it with us. Our seminarian, James Vu, photographed with the



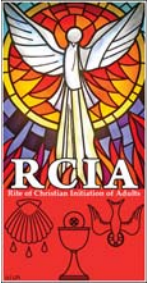
students on their last day, helped teach and worked primarily with the fifth grade level. It was a good week for many, and we thank Barbara Normand and her great staff who help make it happen each year.

Last Sunday, Deacon George Hooper also took the Lord's yoke upon himself as he officially began Diaconate ministry here among us. He shares a little bit about himself below. I know you will appreciate getting to know him and serving with him. *"I am excited about joining the Immaculate Conception family on July 1<sup>st</sup>. I have prepared for this with six years of study and almost one year as a deacon intern at St. Alphonsus in Greenwell Springs. My wife, Ellie, and I have been parishioners of St. Thomas More Parish for about 20 years. I graduated from De La Salle High School in New Orleans and LSU in Baton Rouge, majoring in accounting. As a CPA, I worked in public accounting and private industry for over 40 years, retiring from The Shaw Group in December, 2011. At St. Thomas More, I was a Eucharistic Adorer and a member of the Wednesday Night Rosary Group. I have also been a lector/commentator at Sunday masses, and a member of the Holy Name Society, the RCIA team and the Formation Commission. I also served two years on the St. Thomas More Pastoral Council and have done some prison ministry work at Elayn Hunt Correctional Center. I enjoy teaching and listening to people. My wife and I enjoy hiking and traveling. I also like to read, watch old classic movies (primarily cowboy and mystery movies) and jog. We have two daughters, Jennifer and Shelley, and three grandsons, Caleb (six years old), Jacob (five years old) and Connor (15 months old). Just like many of you, we were flooded last August. We spent seven months living with my daughter and son-in-law in Brusly until our new house was finished. We downsized some but are still struggling unpacking and making our new house our home. I look forward to meeting and serving all of you."*

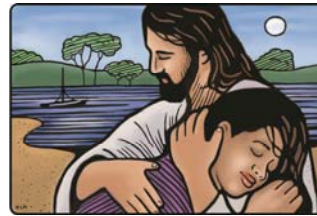
