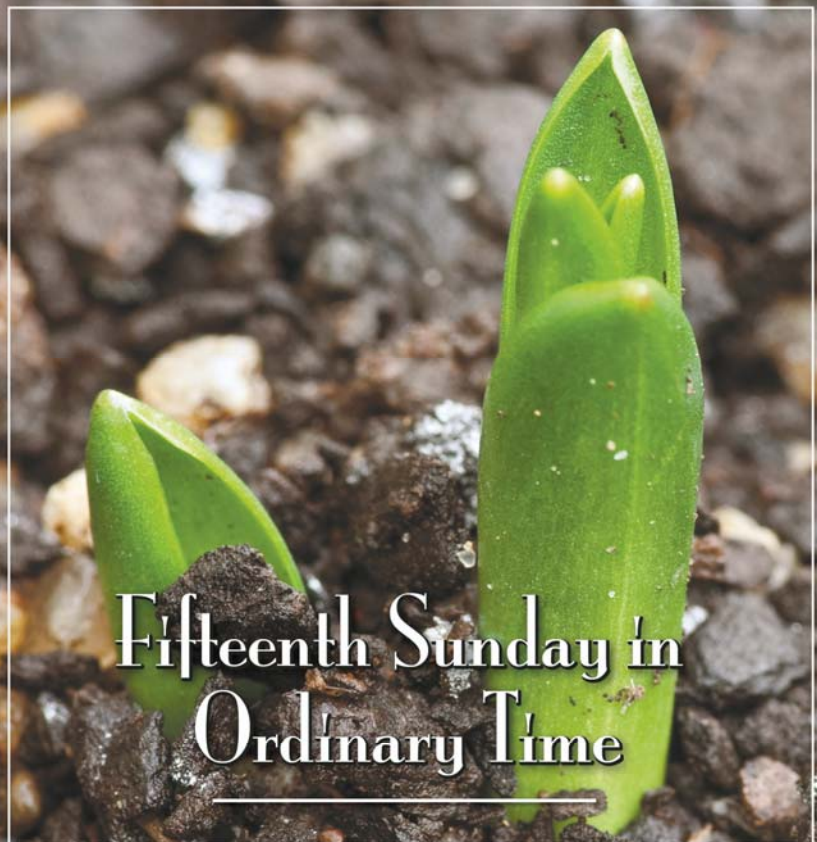

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time In Summer

As we celebrate this Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Gospel this Sunday speaks of God's Word which is sown in our hearts and world as well as the rain which nourishes it. In our first reading Isaiah compares the Word of God to the rain from the heavens, pouring down, soaking the earth, softening it and nourishing it so that it produces many fruits. Rain is essential to growth and life, and without it, the land is unable to release its potential. So too, for the Christian. The Word of God which is compared to the rain is essential for our spiritual growth. Like the rain, the meaning, imagery and teachings of God's Word are meant to soak into our hearts, permeate our lives and so release the spiritual potential to be faithful disciples and heirs of the Kingdom.

Our semi-annual Blood Drive was held last Sunday, and it was nice to walk into the Large Hall and see all six beds filled with parishioners giving blood, and others



seated in chairs waiting to take their places. 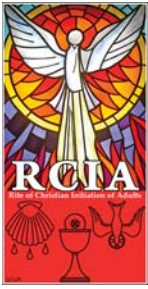

**Recognizing God in your Ordinary Moments**



Over the years I have wasted a lot: a lot of money, a lot of time, and a lot of talent. Sometimes I didn't realize I was wasting these things but, after reflection, I realized I could have done more and accomplished much greater things. Of course, I think that is part of our imperfect humanity. It truly is easier for us to waste our gifts than grow them into something more.

The parable of the sower speaks about the word of God that gets planted in our hearts. If the soil of our heart is rich, then the word will grow and change us. If that soil is rocky or full of weeds, the word will lie there without any impact, bearing no fruit.

This parable can be applied to living a stewardship way of life as well. As sowers, we have been given the seeds of our time, talent, and treasure. We have a choice of where to plant these gifts. As good everyday stewards, we are called to plant them wisely and prudently. Oftentimes it is not enough to simply give away what we have. We need to discern the best places to sow these gifts so the maximum harvest can grow. This takes prayer, reflection, and study. Without a solid discernment process, we can find ourselves sowing seeds endlessly without much to show for it. But joyful is the person who has used one's gifts wisely, for the bounty of the harvest is great.
