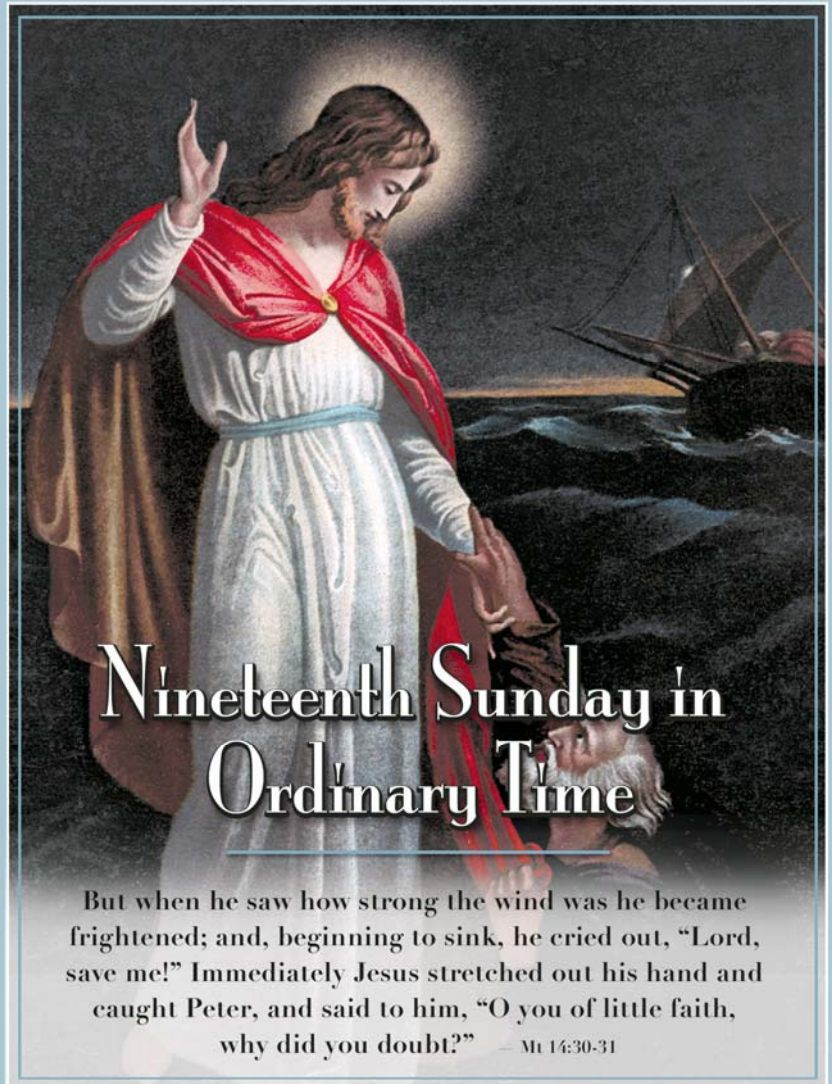

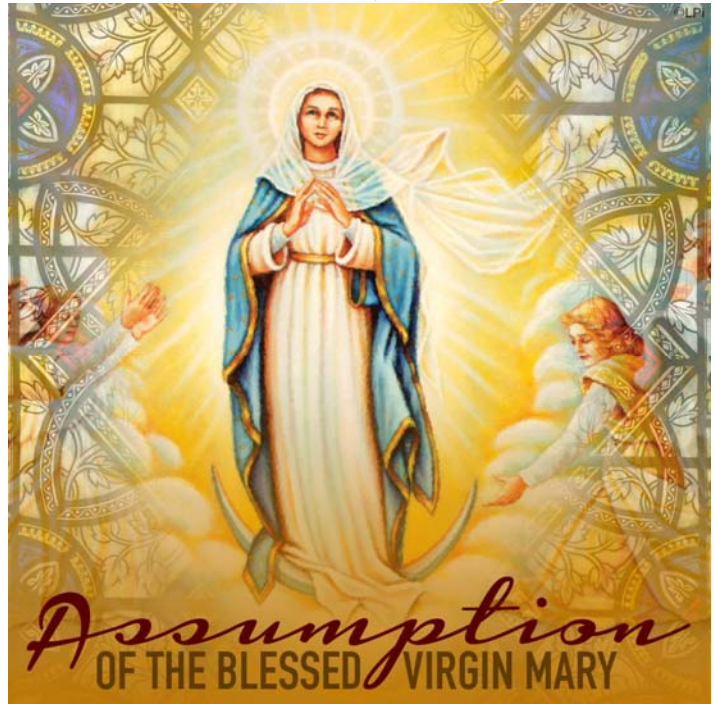

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Blessings

As we continue through Ordinary Time, school has begun in Livingston Parish, we have had our initial meetings with 71 Confirmation Candidates and their parents, and have had our first Inquiry Session. As the civil parish began another school year, we began another ministry year. It is a good feeling to be doing this together after all that has happened this past year.

Something new this year is a special ministry we are looking to soon begin, called our Welcome Center. We are hoping to get this started next month, but plans are in process of getting it set up. It grew out of our last Council of Ministries meeting. It's something we had discussed earlier at staff meetings as a possibility, but we never really committed ourselves to it until our last Council of Ministries meeting. We will explain it in more detail as we move through August and get a better handle on it ourselves, but basically what we would like to do is have a Welcome Center station in the church foyer, around where the Altar Guild used to have their religious article shop. Someone would be there fifteen minutes or so before and after Sunday Liturgies to answer questions anyone, especially visitors, might have about the parish, ministries, or other programs which we might be having. I like to compare it to a good concierge desk like you might find in the finer hotels, where you can have questions answered, receive help, directions, etc. It will involve a commitment from many to staff it, but it will not be a major commitment of time, mostly to be there before and after the Eucharist for a little while. The credenza near the Welcome Center will be stocked with fliers and other information which can be given to those who request it. It is just another way of our trying to truly be a "welcoming community" as described in our mission statement. We would appreciate your thinking about this ministry, how we can make it most effective and helpful and especially, if you have the gift of hospitality and ability to make others feel welcome and at ease, please prayerfully consider a commitment to this new ministry.

Children's Church will also be starting up again soon and while we still have our core group of ministers which has been serving in this ministry for the last few years, we would appreciate more volunteers to serve with them, first to learn the ministry with them, and then to lead the children in their prayerful activities when you feel ready. If you feel you would like to "test the waters" and try out this beautiful ministry with our young parishioners at the Sunday 11:00 Eucharist, please call Sherry Leger or me at the parish office, 665-5359.

This Sunday marks the first anniversary of the flood which began on Friday, the 12th and continued through the night, and in some places on the 14th. I know these

have been trying months for all, and it has been beautiful to see the concern so many have shown for their neighbors while suffering from the flood's effects in their own homes and businesses. These months have been months in which we have seen a lot of coming together, experienced our own pain and the pain of others. We thank the good God who led the Israelites through the waters of the Red Sea to freedom; who led us through the waters of Baptism to a new life; and through the waters of the flood to today. May we continue to be open to his love and help all of our days.

As we observe the one year anniversary of the flood, and near the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven this Tuesday, I thought it might be a good time to share with you a little bit of our history. The day after the waters receded from the church grounds we celebrated the first Eucharist in the flooded church on August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption. We were only a handful of



people able to come, but it was good. Back in 1981, **Phyllis Hartman** gave the statue of **Our Lady of the Smiles** to the parish in memory of her father and father-in-law, Albert V. Deckert and Louis W. Hartman. In 1995 Ngoc Chien wrote a prayer for Mother's Day, thanking Mary for leading him and his family safely through the waters to Denham Springs, a new land, where they would live and grow as parishioners of Immaculate Conception. He had the prayer engraved on a plaque which was destroyed in the

flood, but a parishioner had a new plaque made which was installed last week. I thought as we neared the Feast of the Assumption, this would be a good time to share the story of the statue and the plaque. The pastor back in 1981, Fr. Ron Walker, wrote, "Mary is not only holding the child Jesus, but seems to be offering Him to us. Thus the statue symbolizes very beautifully the role of Mary in the world and in the Church...to present Christ to us as Lord and Savior."

As we commemorate the anniversary of the flood, let us remember in prayer those who are still suffering from being displaced, let us remember those who have returned to school, as well as one another, in prayer as we celebrate the Feast of Mary this Tuesday. Love,

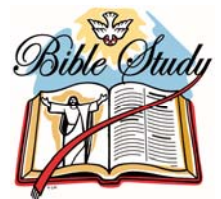

Stump the Deacon!

Is God punishing us with this flood? (originally posted in August 2016)



I think not. If we deserve punishment it will come soon enough and will be much more personal. But perhaps we are being disciplined. The difference is that discipline implies training or learning. It has a purpose and a meaning, a desired outcome. A father disciplines his son to make him a better man. St Paul tells us that God disciplines those He loves as a father disciplines his son. Perhaps God is trying to make us better persons, better Christians.

The lesson here may be different for each of us. Perhaps He is trying to tell us that we are too attached to material goods, goods that can so easily be lost or destroyed. Perhaps He is trying to tell us that we need to be better neighbors to one another and be more concerned with other people's needs. Perhaps He is just trying to get our attention. To remind us how much we depend on Him and not our own strength.

St Paul also tells us that no one appreciates discipline until they see the results, the fruits of their pain. Today as we struggle to rebuild our homes and our lives we need to pray. Pray that God will show us the purpose and meaning of our suffering. Pray that He will be with us to guide us through this. Pray that He will give us the grace to become the Christians He wants us to become. —*Deacon Rudy Stahl*
