This presence is made available to us daily through the Mass where we are infused into the powerful instruments of God's work and become spiritually nourished believers. Likewise, a person suffering with illness needs the transforming power of blood to have a chance of continued life. This blood comes from the sacrifice of another. Just as Christ shed His blood for us, so too we are called to share what sustains us with another in dire need. Holiday Food Basket /Gift Program 2017

St. Vincent de Paul Care Center is offering Thanksgiving/Christmas food baskets and a gift program for the needy. To apply, you must attend a screening at Immaculate Conception Church (865 Hatchell Lane) on Tuesday, October 10, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. First come, first serve for 160 Thanksgiving or 160 Christmas food baskets and/or gifts for 120 families. Those applying for the gift program for children 12 and under must have custody and bring birth certificates, SS card, or report card for each child. A Picture ID, power bill, rent receipt (or mortgage statement for your address in your name), and proof of income (food stamp report works well) is needed for all in the household. Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time

This Sunday the Gospel gives us a lot of hope and consolation, especially if we know there are times we have not “risen to the occasion” when God was calling. The core message of the parable of the workers in the vineyard is that God owes us nothing, and yet he has given us everything.

At work, we may sometimes feel there has been an injustice done when someone gets a promotion you felt you earned. In school, the student who studied really hard for a test and received a C isn't that happy with the one who didn't prepare at all and received an A. When we see someone walking around seeming to be so blessed with everything someone could wish for, we might be tempted to think, “Why them and not me?” Would we ask the same question if we saw someone who just lost their job, received an F on their exam, or someone who was sick and dying?

In today's Gospel, we might be tempted to take sides with those laborers who worked all day and didn't make any more money than those who showed up barely in time to collect their pay at the end of the workday. Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel that God is much like the landowner, generous in forgiving as Isaiah said in our first reading today. We owe him a debt we could never repay. The Father sent his son to die for us all. God owes us nothing, and yet he has given us everything, placing us forever in his debt. We are called to be as forgiving and generous as God has been with us. May the good God help us do this.

I thank Fr. Bob Stine, who recently retired, for taking my place this weekend at the 9:00 and 11:00 Liturgies. When I was leaving my first assignment at St. Isidore, Fr. Bob, recently ordained, was assigned to St. Isidore to take my place. He's still at it. 😊

This week I will be returning from vacation on Friday, and Fr. Raj and I will be leaving for Priests' Retreat at Manresa on next Monday, October 2. Often times I go right from days in the office and around the parish to retreat, and when I arrive I just sort of “fall apart.” I get so relaxed that when I go to the talks I have a hard time staying awake. I usually sit right up front and it is embarrassing to feel myself nodding when I am right in front of the retreat director's face. However this year I will be coming from a week's vacation and a weekend in the parish, so I ought to be behaving pretty well. I'm glad because the retreat director this year is a good friend I have known for years, Abbot Justin Brown from St. Joseph Abbey near Covington. The theme for the Retreat is **"The Way of the Disciple With the Gospel as our Guide."** It looks like it will be a really good retreat, and vacation days will keep me from losing a

friend by nodding off in front of him. 😊 We will be back from retreat Thursday evening and back in the office October 6.

Half of our Confirmation Candidates went to Angola September 9 for our first Confirmation




Retreat. It was a really good retreat, and I was really proud of their participation in the retreat during discussion times. Some parents and sponsors chose to participate also which was nice. Our second retreat for remaining candidates will be Saturday, November 11th. While I usually tried to go, this year I will be going on both as there is no priest on Saturdays at Angola to celebrate the Eucharist with them. **On Tuesday, September 12, all candidates with sponsors, some with parents and grandparents filled the church for the Rite of Enrollment.** After the homily, they signed the



Book of Enrollment, signifying their commitment to these last months of preparation to complete their Christian Initiation in Confirmation. Let us commit also

to prayer for them as they move forward on this stage of their journey.

A change in leadership was announced this month as Jessica Cowart accepted the role of Respect Life Coordinator here in the parish. The Respect Life Committee will have a meeting Tuesday, September 26. Stump the Deacon!

At what point in our Church's history (before Vatican II) was the Mass Liturgy structured so that every Catholic church followed the same order of readings, prayers, homily and Eucharistic Celebration?

Judy H. Bullock, Th.M., Ed.D, in her book *Understanding Catholic Worship, a Handbook for People in the Pews* discusses the readings at Mass. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, there were only two scriptural readings during each Mass, one Epistle and one Gospel passage, and the same set of readings was proclaimed each year on the same Sunday. After Vatican II, a new Lectionary was introduced in 1971 which included a three-year cycle of readings that included three readings, as well as a responsorial psalm.
