Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Planning

Ordinary Time ends for a while as we begin the Lenten Season this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. While for many of us, this may also be a long Mardi Gras weekend, hopefully we will also have a little time to do fine tuning on our plans for a good and graced Lenten season.

This Sunday, February 11, is also the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, proclaimed a number of years ago as a World Day of Prayer for the Sick.

Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day. I have had the privilege



of visiting at Lourdes a number of times, and have always been so impressed by the number of ill who are visiting there and the tremendous care given to them. Youth from

around France and Europe often give of their time and vacation days to come and assist. It is an impressive and beautiful sight to behold, a fantastic coming together. You may know this, but the Lourdes Grotto in Convent is the oldest in the United States. The Marist priests who ministered in Convent were very devoted to the Blessed Mother and were also all French, so it is no wonder that things happened as they did. When I was in Convent, many came to the Grotto at St. Michael's from all over to offer prayer for their loved ones. **This is a Fr. Frank story:** 😊 When I was there, we had a recirculating fountain which came down the side of the grotto into a pool. The last time I was at Lourdes, I arrived with a suitcase of empty liter soft drink bottles which I filled up with Lourdes water and brought back to Convent in my baggage. I filled the pool and fountain with the Lourdes water. Obviously this was before all the luggage restrictions and security were in place, but it was a great feeling. Looking back, I can't believe I did this. It still makes me smile. **Let us keep our sick and their caregivers in our prayers today.**

Also planning these days are the Friends of the St. Joseph Altar who had their initial planning pot-luck



supper as we neared the end of January. Cookies are already being baked and much has been set in place. The St. Joseph Altar will be blessed on Friday, March 16th, and the dinner will be on Saturday, the 17th of March.

As we prepare to begin Lent, it is also good to reflect on the Guidelines for Fasting and Abstinence given to us by the National Council of Catholic Bishops. Ash

Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. I really think there is a really positive good about these rules. While a lot of our Lenten penances, prayer and almsgiving might be personal, this fasting and abstinence is something we do as a Church, a Universal Church. For me personally, I think it's great to know that you and others are all doing this together with me. There is a unity there which should help us have a good Lent.

I don't think anyone will forget, but it's a nice coincidence that Ash Wednesday this year falls on Valentine's Day, a beautiful reminder that our Lenten Journey and all it entails is a Journey of Love. This Thursday in the first reading Moses presents the commandments to the Israelites and tells them to "choose life," basically to see the commandments not as laws but in terms of their covenant with God, their life-giving relationship with God. In a lot of ways, we can do the same thing this Lent, trying to see our prayer, our sacrifices and penance, our almsgiving as expressions of love, love for those around us, and love for the God who has first loved us. Have a good Lent. Love,

Stump the Deacon!

This year, Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent, is on February 14 which is also Valentine’s Day. Valentine’s Day is a big day of celebration for me and my spouse. We usually go out and have a nice dinner. Are we still obliged to fast and abstain from eating meat on this day?

Yes, you are. For Catholics, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are required days of fasting AND abstinence. In addition, Fridays during Lent are required days of abstinence. Even though the flyer in last week’s bulletin explained the Lenten requirements, I thought it would still be appropriate to go over these regulations again.

On a day of fast, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal. No snacks or liquids (other than water) can be taken between meals. Fasting is required from age 18 through 59.

Abstinence means that you cannot eat meat on that day. Abstinence from meat is binding for members of the Catholic Church who are 14 years old or older.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

You have a couple of options. On Ash Wednesday, you can eat two smaller meals during the day and take your spouse to a nice restaurant that night to enjoy a meatless meal, such as fish, lobster or other seafood dishes. Or, you can do what my wife and I are doing; we are celebrating Valentine’s Day one day early at a local restaurant.
