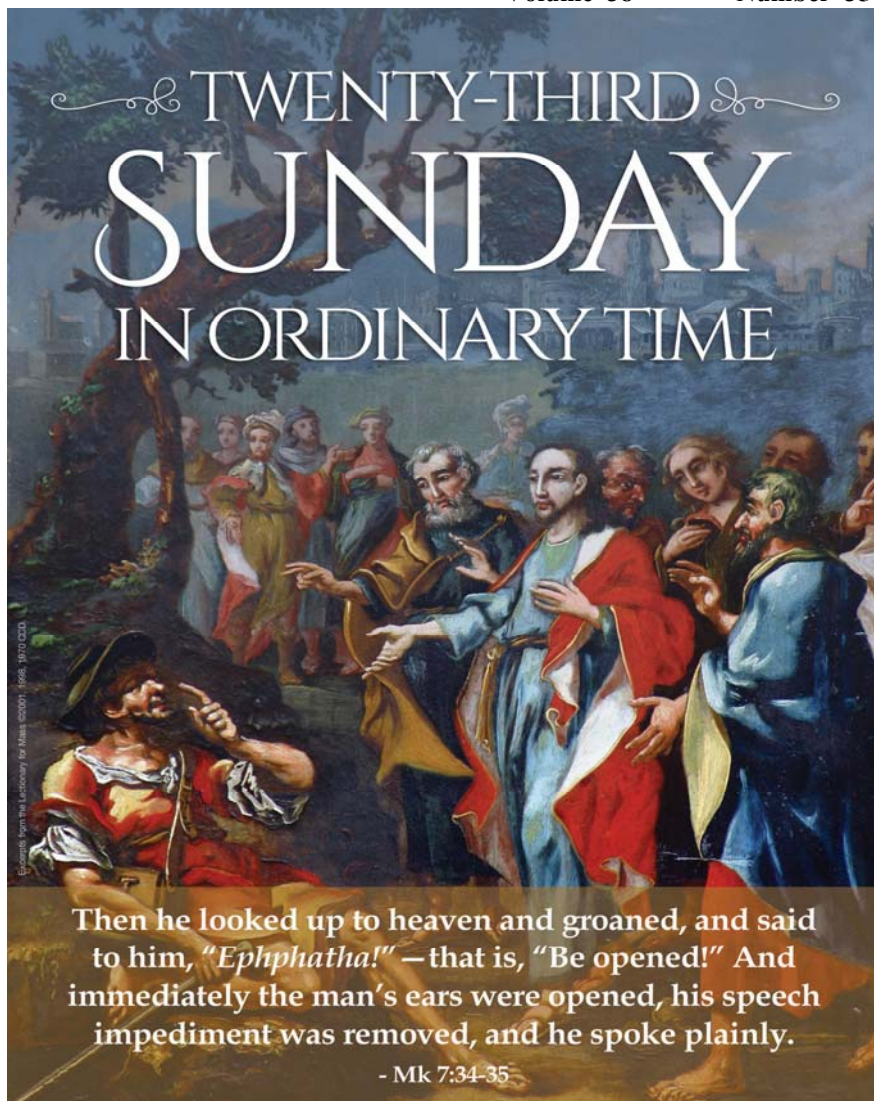

They are the Greek letters X (chi) and P (roe) which are the first two letters of Jesus’ title: Christ

What do the letters HIS stand for?

They are Latin letters that stand for “In Hoc Signo” which means “In This Sign”. It is reported that the Emperor Constantine had a vision of the Greek letters XP in the sky as he prepared for battle. He was told that in this sign you will conquer. He had the sign of the XP painted on his men’s shields and they were victorious. Later when he became emperor, he made Christianity the religion of the state. Prompting St. Jerome to say “the Church has won its freedom, but lost its independence.”

It was a privilege to offer a prayer with them, asking God's blessing on our catechetical year. There was such a good spirit of energy and (as you can see) smiles in the room, you had

to know it would be good. As I write this, we still need two seventh grade teachers for Monday at 4:30. We thank all who are working with this ministry and ask you to please keep them in prayer as the year progresses. Our P.S.R. begins on Sunday, September 13 at 4:30.

This Sunday the Prophet Isaiah in our First Reading prophesies "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing." I would like to think that this would be a good prophecy for the coming Pastoral Year, if we see this in a relative way. I know personally, that sometimes when something finally hits me and I am aware of something new, it is almost like I was blind or deaf before, the new awareness is such a blessing and gift. When we speak about ongoing formation, be it in P.S.R., a Bible Study, That Man Is You, R.C.I.A., Children's

Church, or simply in reading and prayer, it is almost like we have been given new sight, new hearing. It is my prayer for the parish that the Prophet Isaiah might be describing what this year can be like for us all.

RCIA had its first meeting August 20 and will continue with Inquiry Sessions through November, till November



22 when we will have the Rites of Acceptance for those who wish to continue on the RCIA journey. We have a good number of adult inquirers this year as well as an equally good number of youth inquirers. Let us keep them also in prayer as they make this journey into the Catholic Church. Though Inquiry Sessions have begun, it is not too late for those wishing to "come and see" to join us on Thursday evenings at 7:00. 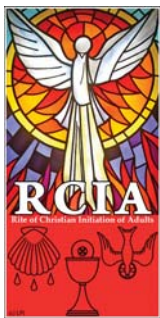

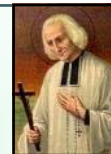
