## Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time

**This Sunday as we hear the Gospel of the Beatitudes, it is good to remember that this was the official introduction to Jesus's ministry.**

Before he began his teaching and healing ministry, he preached today's Gospel on the side of the hill, "The Sermon on the Mount." Happily, a few months before coming here to Immaculate Conception in 2009, I had the opportunity to visit the Holy Land, and celebrate the Eucharist on top of the hill where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. Most, myself included, would like to celebrate the Eucharist outside on the side of the hill where Jesus first gave this homily, but bad weather

forced us to celebrate the Eucharist in the church (above and at right) which was built on the top of the hill. But it was a nice church and I remember that when I was preparing to celebrate the Eucharist there, I was thinking that I was also preparing to begin anew, to begin what would probably be my last assignment as a pastor of the Diocese. I

kept thinking how privileged I was to be beginning a new ministry praying on the hill where Jesus officially began his ministry. I didn't know you yet, but I remember praying for you, and for all those in the parish who hungered and thirsted, those who mourned, all those with special needs and gifts, that with his help, I would be able to minister here as he would minister himself.

It was so good when I arrived to meet so many of you who were already ministering to each other and to the larger community as Jesus did. I was not only being called to lead you, but also learn from you. It was a fantastic feeling as I got to know the parish, and nothing has changed. The parish just keeps getting better and better and I thank you for your wonderful Stewardship of Ministry, your stewardship of all the gifts our good God has entrusted to us.

**I was sorry to hear a few weeks ago that we might be losing our Cub Scout Pack** because we do not have persons ready to be adult leaders. I can stand corrected, but I believe Cub Scout Pack 283 has been here at Immaculate

Conception for over ten years. It is a good recruiting source for the Boy Scout Troop 283 which we also sponsor, and our ICC Student Ministry groups. Please Contact Danny Bennett (225-505-6062) if you can help or have a boy interested in joining.

**The Adoration Chapel is about finished, and only a few details remain to be worked out with the building.**

However, before we resume Perpetual Adoration, we need to know how we stand in terms of committed adorers. This weekend Allison Renfrow will have volunteers join her after all the Liturgies at tables outside the church. They will have the listing of all the hours, 24/7, showing what times have committed adorers and what hours may need committed adorers. As to be expected, after the flood there are vacancies, because some have moved, and others are not yet settled in their restored homes. It would be really good if you could take time to see what commitment (s) you could make. It would be good for you, as well as good for many others.

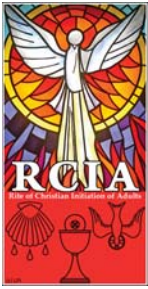
It was in December 2015 that biopsies revealed that I had cancer in the prostate gland. Because the tumors totaled about 6 on the Gleason scale, the doctors recommended just watching it for the time being. Last December, other biopsies revealed that just one of the tumors was now a 7 and another was a 9 on the scale and they determined that something needed to be done as they seemed to be aggressive, but they first needed to be sure it hadn't spread. Thus, two weeks ago I had a Bone Scan and CT Scan which showed it had not spread yet, but something needed to be done right away. The doctors felt the best thing for me would be radiation which would be administered once a day over a period of time. So now I have a Radiation Oncologist whom I will be meeting this Tuesday, who will be guiding me through this aspect of treatment. When we met for Formation Days the second week of January, the Bishop shared the Anointing of the Sick with me and other priests of the Diocese who were ill, which was concelebrated by the other priests of the Diocese who imposed hands also. It was a good and graced time. (And I'm feeling fine! 😊)

**This Friday we were scheduled to have our Annual Ministry Appreciation Supper,** but this bulletin had to go to press on Tuesday. I hope to say a bit more about it next week, but one thought crossed my mind which I thought I might share now. When we say "Ministry Appreciation," we often think of thanking those in ministries and rightly so, but another thought is, "Thanking God for having the loving confidence in calling us all to ministries in his name." We appreciate and thank our good God and Father for this.

**Recognizing God in your Ordinary Moments**

Sometimes I wonder what this world will look like when my children get to be my age. Everything seems to be changing so rapidly and much of that change doesn't seem to be for the good. I do think in some ways the Church is experiencing resurgence and a strengthening, but it will have to in the face of an increasing culture of atheism and selfishness.



Of course, I bet my parents wondered the same thing when I was a child. As much as things change, they remain the same. When Jesus gave his Sermon on the Mount, I would guess some parents there were having the same kind of worries. But Jesus proposed a way of life in the beatitudes that was countercultural then and is countercultural now.

In his book, "Life of Christ," Fulton Sheen said this: "The Sermon on the Mount is so much at variance with all that our world holds dear that the world will crucify anyone who tries to live up to its values." Living a stewardship way of life means bringing the beatitudes into our daily lives in a profound way. However, it also means living in a way that others may not understand or they may even turn away from us because of it. But with the reward in the end being the kingdom of heaven, the choice is really a matter of life and death, eternally speaking.

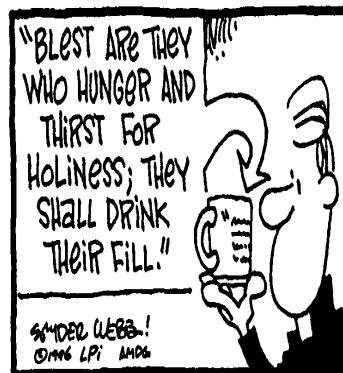
