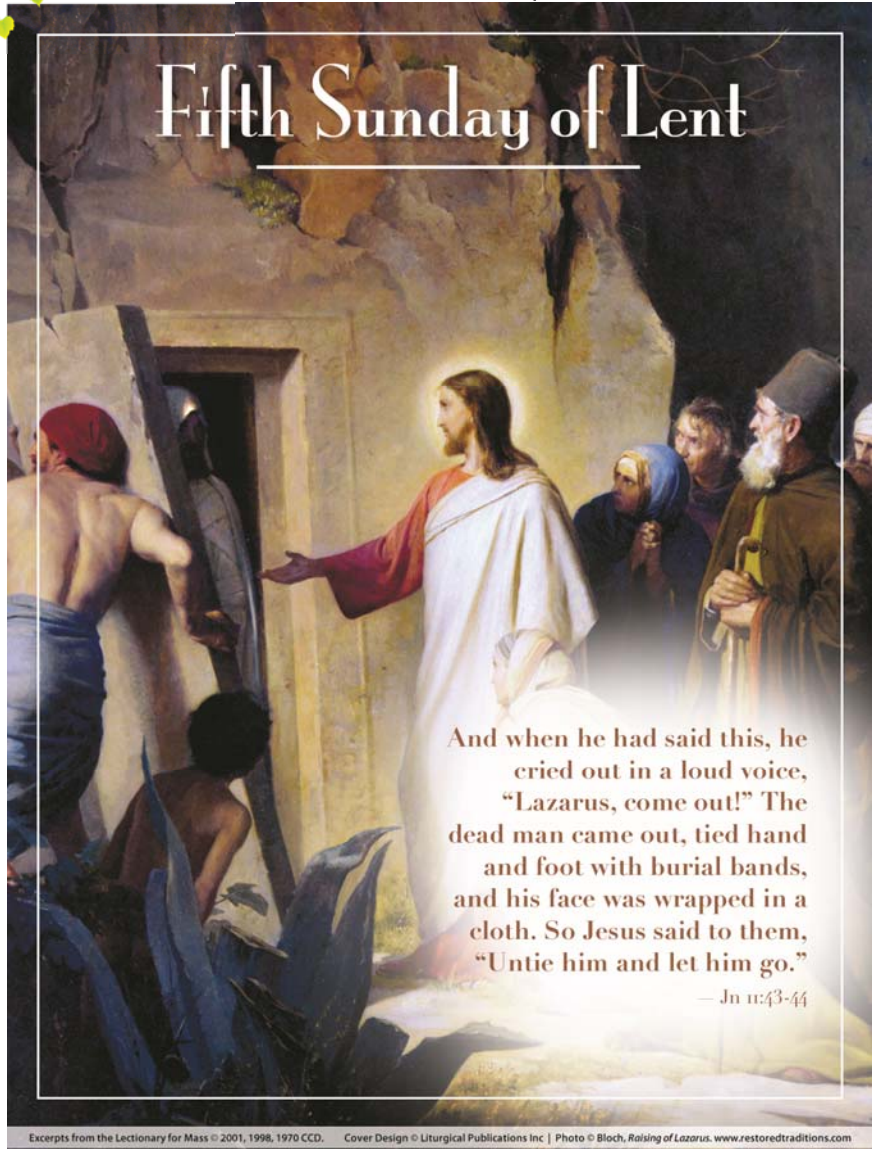

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: A Lenten Journey

This Fifth Sunday of Lent's Gospel invites us to "roll away the stone." I love this Gospel, this quote and the



hymn that comes from it. Our Scriptures today go straight to the heart of our Christian faith. They speak of death and of new life in Christ. In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel we hear: "Thus says the Lord God. O my people I will open your graves and have you rise from them, and bring you back to

the land of Israel." In the Gospel reading, the stone has been rolled back from the tomb of Lazarus. Christ commanded that he be released from all that bound him up, and then set him free. What does this mean for us as we continue through these last weeks of Lent, 2017?

One question might be, what guides our approach to life? The defeats of the past or the hope of the future? The Lord speaks through Isaiah: "Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not. See, I am doing something new." God wants us to see things freshly, in ways ever new. How can we see things anew? How can we, with God's help, see life with a fresh perspective? One way is to try and avoid comparisons and passive resignation to our "fate" in life. This can pull us down and prevent us from seeing the present and future as God would have us see them. There will always be setbacks in life, but setbacks aren't the same as defeat. Christ can roll back the imprisoning stones that imprison our hearts. As we move toward Easter, let us seek to roll away whatever stones may remain separating us from the love of our Risen Lord.

As the hymn goes, "...They have been saying, no one hears the singing; They have been saying all our strength is gone; Roll away the stone, see the glory of God..."

A date has been set to reopen the Adoration Chapel, but if we can keep this date depends on you. Because we usually close the Adoration Chapel during the Triduum and reopen it on Easter Sunday evening at 6:00 with Easter Evening Prayer, we thought Easter Sunday would be the ideal date to reopen the Chapel which will have been closed eight months. It is all newly refurbished and really beautiful, but has been waiting for beautiful Committed Adorers to be able to reopen. Presently we only need two hours committed and we also need to contact those who said they wished to remain committed adorers once they were back home to see if they are home now. It will be pushing it, but we hope to be able to do this. It would be a fantastic

way to end the Easter Triduum with Easter Evening Prayer in the newly reopened Adoration Chapel. Volunteers can contact Allison Renfrow at arenfrow05@bellsouth.net. I thank Allison in everyone's name for all the time and effort she has put into helping us reopen.

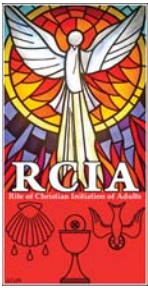


broke into different groups with varied tasks. These have been good occasions of coming together during Lent and we thank all who participated throughout the season.

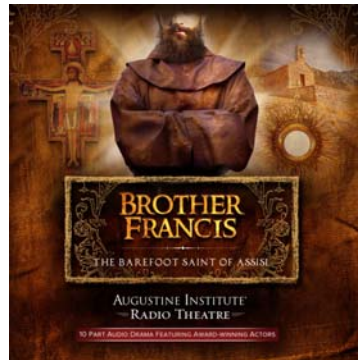

**Passion (Palm) Sunday
