Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Saints

It was nice celebrating the Feast of All Saints with you Wednesday, November 1. All Saints Day is a wonderful celebration of unity, our unity in the Body of Christ, our unity with the Saints on Earth (as St. Paul often referred to the Church) and the Saints in Heaven. It was a beautiful way to begin a month filled with the awareness of the many ways we have been blessed, which will lead up to the celebration of Thanksgiving and the Feast of Christ the King.

A few years ago I was in Wittenberg Germany, doing a bit of ancestor research and several of the churches and monuments were shrouded in scaffolding as this part of Germany was preparing to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation which recently took place 31 October 2017. It was on 31 October 1517, that Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses or propositions for debate on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. This set in motion a series of events which in time came to be known as the Reformation. I had two ancestors, father and son, who were Evangelical (Lutheran) pastors in Germany. Georg Paschasius was



pastor in Salzwedel, and his son, Paulius Paschasius, born in 1564, was pastor in Priorau, the small church on the left. The Family Tree goes: Georg Paschasius is the father of Paulus

Paschasius, the father of Paulo Paschasio, the father of Agnes Paschasio, the mother of Christoph Schwartzkopf (father), who is the father of Christoph Schwartzkopf (son), the father of Anna Dorothea Schwartzkopf who is the mother of Dorothea Elisabeth Meier who is the mother of Gottlob Uhde the father of Marius Carl Christian Uhde, the father of Franz Ignatz Uhde, the father of Frank Marion Uter, born 5 June 1868, in New Orleans, the father of Frank Marion Uter, born 4 November 1908, in Hattiesburg, the father of Frank Marion Uter, born 9 June, 1944, the pastor of Immaculate Conception, Denham Springs. Back in the 1990's when I was Ecumenical Officer for the Diocese and pastor of the Cathedral, we had a beautiful prayer service led by the Bishop of Baton Rouge and the Lutheran Bishop of Louisiana and Texas. It all makes for good memories as we continue to pray for unity. Lutherans generally commemorate the Reformation on October 31.

While we will have the posters in the Faith Formation Center classrooms and office, I thought you might like a glimpse of the Vocation Poster with photographs of our 2017-2018 seminarians. I don't know all of them, but have had the opportunity to work with and visit several of them. They are a really good group of young men. Prayer



cards for vocations and for our seminarians are available in the church foyer. I pray for each one of them by name in the morning when praying Morning Prayer. Let's keep them all in our prayers.

Last week I mentioned the Festival this year included a lot of new – new games, signs, activities – because much had been lost in the flood. But there was also a lot of familiar for which we are all grateful. In addition to the many who have cooked and worked different stations for years, we were blessed to again have the services of Gwen Bennett who spoke at all the Sunday Liturgies twice, arranged to make sure all booths were covered and other aspects of the Festival would proceed well. She was doing this when I first came here eight years ago, and I mistakenly thought she was Festival Chairperson. Also a word of thanks to Jane Collier who began work on the \$10,000 raffle early on and was selling up to the last minute. She was only 31 tickets shy of selling all 500. We thank all who worked together to make the Festival such a success. Love,

Stump the Deacon!

When I go to Communion, should I receive both the Body and the Blood of Christ?

The practice of receiving Holy Communion under both species goes back to the first days of the church in response to the Lord's command to "take and eat...take and drink." This practice continued until late in the eleventh century, when the custom of distributing the Eucharist to the faithful under the form of bread alone began to grow. The Council of Constance in 1415 decreed that Holy Communion under the form of bread alone would be distributed to the faithful. Since the Church teaches that the Body and the Blood of Christ are present under both the consecrated bread and the consecrated wine, a communicant receiving Holy Communion under the form of bread alone actually receives the Body and Blood of Christ. In 1963, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council reauthorized distributing Holy Communion under both species. The Catechism of the Catholic Church notes: "...the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharist meal appears more clearly." (CCC 1390). All that being said, when the consecrated wine is offered, the choice of whether to receive it is an individual decision. Those who choose to receive only the Host, however, are not depriving themselves of anything. As the Catechism notes, they still receive "all the fruit of Eucharistic grace" when receiving only the Host.
