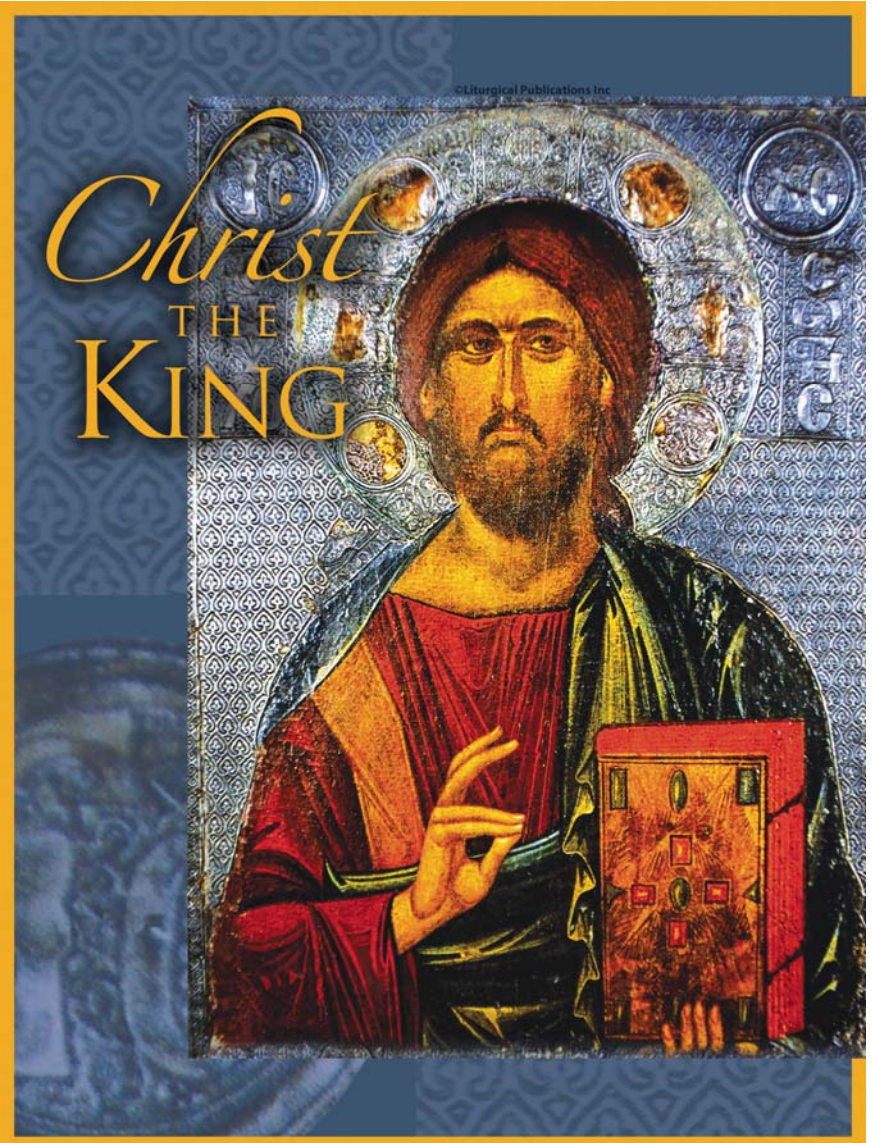

In Advent, we prepare for the two comings of Christ, to celebrate his coming as a baby in Bethlehem, and his return at the end of time as the King of Glory. This celebration of Christ's Kingship prepares us for both comings of the Christ. The only crown that Jesus ever wore was made of thorns, as he prepared to give his life for us. On this last Sunday of the Church Year, let us express our sorrow for not having served as he may have called us, and our resolve to let him lead us in ways of service in imitation of him.

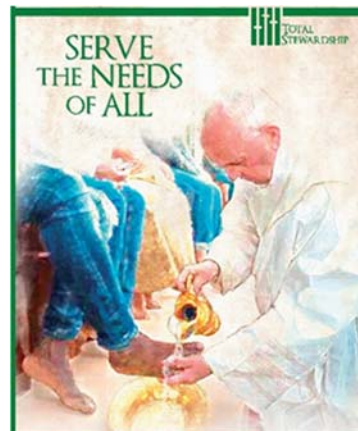
(665-5359) and he will answer any questions you might have and accompany you. Or you can call the vocation office at the number above if you would rather keep it more private.

**An update on our Parish Council of Ministries:** On November 7, I had Novena and Benediction and was a bit late for the Council of Ministries meeting. Other than parish staff, there were only two or three parishioners there. They recommended that the Council of Ministries be dissolved for the time being and we will explore the possibility of another means to bring parishioners together. For the time being, the general consensus is that if a parishioner has an issue or idea they wish to have explored or discussed, they can mention it to one of the priests or deacons who will discuss it with me and we will decide which of the staffs or committees can best discuss it and make recommendations. In some cases we might invite the parishioner to attend the particular staff or committee meeting and make the presentation him or herself. For the time being, the Finance

Council will continue to be the body I approach when important decisions involving the parish need to be made.

**Next Sunday will be the first Sunday of Advent. We will begin a new Liturgical Year and what better way to begin a new year than with a Re-Commitment to Prayer.**

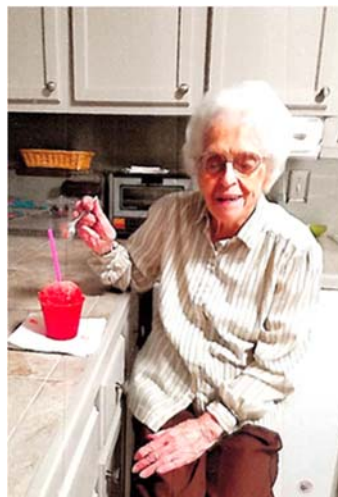

### RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children

The catechumenate phase of RCIA which began Sunday, November 19<sup>th</sup> marks the beginning of formal instruction in the Catholic faith. Prospective Catholics learn the basics of the faith and how to live the Catholic way of life. The catechumenate focuses on Jesus, His teachings, the Church and the Sacraments. During this phase, the catechumen/candidate will take part in the Sunday Liturgy of the Word although they do not participate in the Eucharist. They will leave the assembly after the homily with a blessing. This dismissal is a powerful sign and public witness to the community of faith of the sincerity and determination of those seeking to become Catholic. It shows that they are seriously pursuing their call and preparing to become full-fledged, committed Catholics. After Sunday, December 10<sup>th</sup>, the catechumenate phase will resume January 7<sup>th</sup>. We ask for your continued prayers for those on this spiritual journey.

What is “right” and “wrong”? Is what’s right for you right for me? Is there a right and wrong for everyone, all the time?

These are difficult questions to discuss in our culture. We live in a society that supports the opinion that each person should make up his or her own morality—that there is no moral truth that applies to everyone. Many of us have been affected by the relativistic outlook that pervades the modern world. Maybe some of us wonder whether there really is an absolute right and wrong for everyone. Or maybe we accept that there is a moral standard for all, but we don’t know how to explain our moral convictions in a convincing way. Maybe some of us are afraid of saying something is immoral because we’re afraid of offending others or of being labeled intolerant. How do we talk about morality in a relativistic world?

In this small group study program featuring Edward Sri, we’ll explore the classical view of morality and find that it’s not merely a set of guiding principles for theoretical situations—it is an entire way of life.

Stump the Deacon!

When we walk into Church, why do we dip our fingers in holy water and make the sign of the cross?

When we dip our fingers in holy water and sign ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, we are called to remember our baptismal covenant.

Those seeking to come into the Catholic Church through RCIA or RCIC may also sign themselves when entering a Catholic Church. Baptized Christians in another faith are already part of the Church of Christ; signing themselves should help them remember their baptism. The unbaptized could sign themselves as a symbol of the sacrament of baptism for which they are preparing.

Secondly, when signing ourselves we should pray "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." This is a very powerful prayer where we profess the deepest mystery of the Christian Faith: the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, three Persons—and the saving work of Christ on the Cross. We are actually praying a creed (a statement of our belief) and marking ourselves as Christians.

*Metanoia* is a word of ancient Greek origin meaning: the journey of changing one's mind, heart, self, or way of life...a term often used by St. Paul in his writings. The mission of the Metanoia Foundation is to build and operate a facility in the Baton Rouge area to house and rehabilitate adolescent female victims of human trafficking for sexual exploitation. This mission seeks to fulfill one of the greatest human needs: freedom from sexual, physical and emotional abuse. This mission includes modeling a rehabilitation and recovery process that is based on a long-term intervention of rebuilding the physical, emotional, and spiritual health of the adolescent victim.

**Metanoia-Inc.** has engaged the services of the Hospitaller Sisters of Mercy to deliver this mission through the creation of a community living together in love and mercy with customized intervention.
