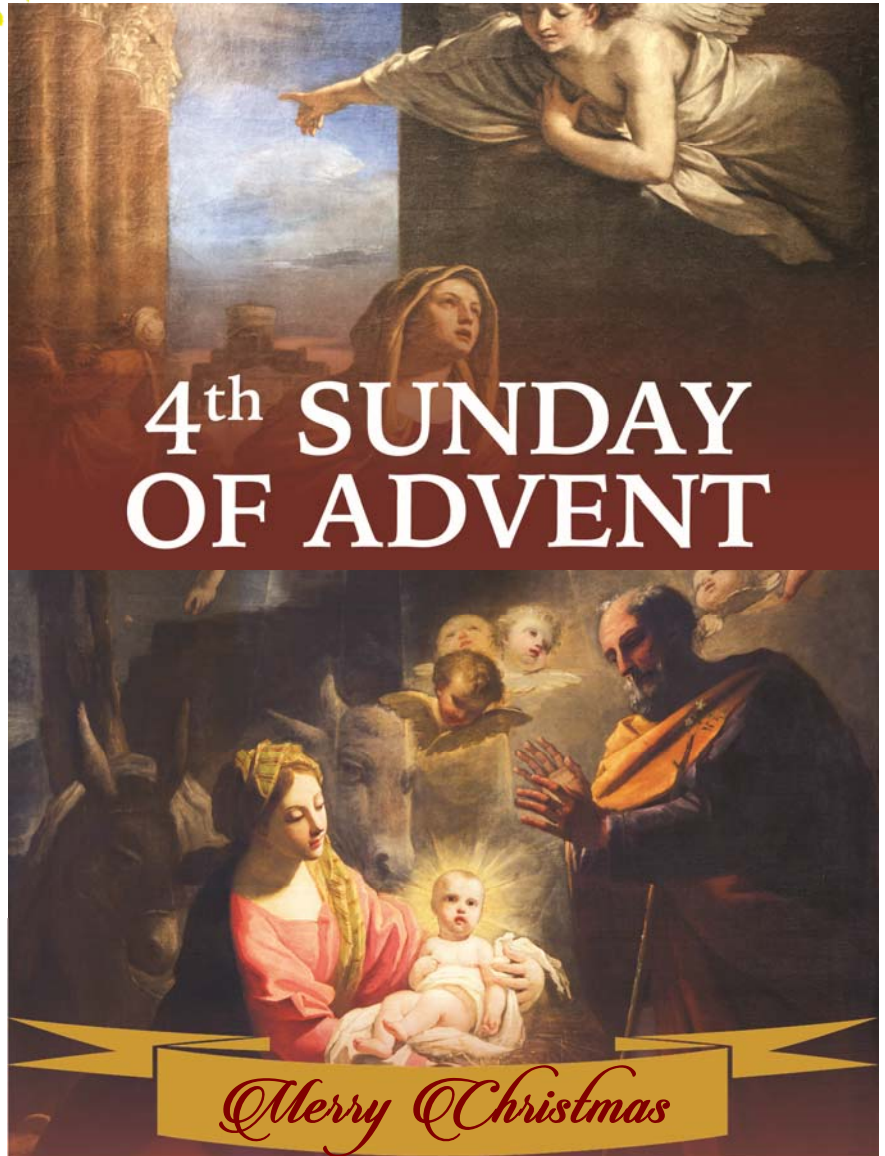

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Moving Quickly

This fourth Sunday of Advent, will be a quick move into Christmas. In fact, the Fourth Week of Advent will last roughly 24 hours, from the 4:00 p.m. Anticipated Eucharist Saturday until the 4:00 p.m. Christmas Vigil Sunday evening. There are a lot of changes that will be taking place, final decorations for Christmas being placed in the church between noon and 4:00, and **most importantly final changes in our hearts for Christmas.**



We read in the Christmas Gospels how there was no room for Jesus, Mary and Joseph in the inn. While this was sad, it was no tragedy. The only tragedy would be if there is no room in our hearts for them and all they have come to share this Christmas. Décor in the church is wonderful and we are grateful to our décor committee. The music is great and we are appreciative to our music ministry and all the other Liturgical Ministers who have prepared to begin this Christmas Season with us, but when all is said and done, the only transition which really matters is the transition which takes place in our hearts and lives. We thank the good God for the gift of his Spirit who assists us in this daily conversion and transition.

The birth of Jesus, the Messiah gives us, the Church, great hope. Although secular celebrations of Christmas may ignore the significance of the holy day, the Church always gives us Advent to help us keep our focus. We reorient our hearts and minds to recall, once again, the mysterious glory of the Incarnation. In these weeks of Advent preparation, we have been called to remind ourselves what it means to be Christian, in case we have begun taking it for granted. To be Christian is to believe that God is truly with us, in the most personal, intimate way imaginable; he is one of us! His life and Spirit is within us. "They shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" Through the Incarnation, God became human and lived among us to love us, to guide us, to heal us, and to strengthen us. It is the promise of a Savior given through the early prophets, a promise that the faithful held dear as they waited. As that most beautiful of all anniversaries approaches, we move into Christmas to celebrate this season remembering the greatest gift ever given to every person--the gift of a Savior.

This Sunday, we light the fourth and last candle on our wreath and a few hours later will be lighting the Christ

Candle in the center of the wreath. The purple ribbons will be changed to red. Let us ask our good God to bless our families on this final Sunday in Advent. A nice prayer which was shared with us is below, a good prayer for these last hours of transition:

**God of surprises,
today we hear about the surprise that Mary
experienced.
She is pregnant with your Son!**

**Help our family to be obedient to your surprises,
however they may spring up in our lives.
All of your gifts work for the benefit of your people.**

**When we light this final candle on our wreath,
let us bring your surprise gift of love
to our neighbors and friends.
We ask this through Christ,
who is the ultimate surprise gift to the world.
Amen.**

Catholic doctrine does not treat this subject in any great detail, so there is no “doctrinal right answer.” A rosary, crucifix, palm branch, or other religious item that is blessed becomes permanently sanctified for a sacred purpose. The key is to dispose of these items respectfully. Burning (and then burying the ashes) or simply burying blessed articles is the traditional method of disposing of these items. If the item does not disintegrate into the earth, such as plastic or cement, it is acceptable to break apart the item and discard it appropriately. A house or a car can be blessed. The object, itself, is not what is significant. Significance lies in asking God to let this item be a reminder to those who use it that God’s love and blessings are present. Therefore, these items can be disposed of in an ordinary manner since they are not dedicated to divine service. In 1874, the Church did give some examples of how to dispose of certain items. Excess or contaminated Holy Water should be poured directly into the ground. Palms should be burned, and the ashes distributed on Ash Wednesday or buried. Broken rosaries or statues should be buried. Devotional items that have not been blessed, such as holy cards received in the mail, can be recycled, gifted, or simply thrown away. If you feel uncomfortable throwing them away, they can be burned also. One other thing to consider: blessed objects (such as bibles) or non-blessed objects (such as booklets or holy cards) that are still in good shape can be donated.
