Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Beginning Together

This Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, the Lord manifested to the Wise Men who traveled together.

Today means many things to many people, but one important aspect which is often overlooked is that they traveled together, each with their own gifts, sharing these gifts with each other that they could successfully complete their journey together. These were "wise men" in the sense that they were seeking wisdom with open minds and hearts. They were non-Jews and



followed what caught their attention and learned from it. They paid attention to the stars and when they saw something special, they sensed something special, and they felt the call to pay more attention to it. Too often we aren't that open to see a new light, a new message, a call to pay attention to something we hadn't really noticed before. They were open to the light, and following that light, they were lead to Bethlehem, where the light had settled.

They returned home by a different route. I really like this note Matthew makes. Often in our encounters with the Lord, when he shines in our darkness, he calls us to continue on our life journey by a different and new path. When we seek the Lord, find him, and allow him to fill us, then our journey takes a new path, not so much because we feel we have to, but because we want to. We want to remain in his love and joy.

As we brought 2017 to a close, I received a thank you note from the Council of Aging in Livingston, and signed by many of the elderly who have enjoyed "fine dining" in our Sacred Heart Mission's parish hall over the years. They moved to their own building in December, and offer their thanks for our having hosted them these past eleven years. We wish them well.

We began the new year with good news concerning the Fall Festival. Once all bills were paid and everything settled, the **Net Income for this year's Fall Festival was \$67,197.03.** This number is especially good if you consider that this year we had many expenses we haven't had in recent years. A lot of the games, signs and other things associated with the Festival had been lost in the flood and had to be rebuilt, repainted or purchased. Now they have been stored and are awaiting next year's Festival. So this

number is a really happy number to be able to publish and we thank all those who made it possible in so many ways.

This Sunday after the Eucharist at the Mission, I will be heading to the Cathedral to celebrate the noon Eucharist with our Confirmation Candidates, their sponsors, and those family members who wish to accompany them. After, they will have lunch and a short afternoon of reflection in preparation for their Confirmation January 19th. We like to bring them to the Cathedral for the Sunday Eucharist prior to their Confirmation so they can experience some of the history of our Diocese and have a broader personal experience of Church. For many of our candidates, they identify Church with Immaculate Conception Parish, which is good, but we also like to give them the chance to identify more with our Local (Diocesan) and Universal Church. Let us keep them in our prayers as they near Confirmation. I had scheduled personal interviews with them as they had their Christmas vacation, and I believe they are and will be such a fantastic gift to our Church and the world. We are very blessed to be sharing Confirmation with them.

We had another blessing over the Christmas Season – on New Year's Day I received word that all Perpetual Adoration slots have been filled. We went through the past several weeks only needing one more, but Monday morning I saw Allison Renfrow at the 8:30 Eucharist with a big smile on her face as she told me that the last slot to be filled was filled. We thank all who participate in this beautiful ministry of prayer in a committed way. Fr. Andrew Merrick, now Diocesan Vocation Director, told me at a National meeting of Vocation Directors that it was recently noted that most entering the seminary in recent years experienced their call during Adoration.

The Christmas Season ends Monday as we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Normally the celebration would be the coming Sunday, but this year, because Christmas fell on a Monday, the Church moved the date to the Monday after the Epiphany of the Lord so as not to extend the Christmas too far in to the new year. Because Lent begins February 14, there would have been only a month between Christmas and Lent.

Over the holidays I was able to go to the Garden View Assisted Living home to join **Joy Soileau,** her family and friends as they celebrated her 95th birthday. When here at home, she participated in the daily Eucharist, but still remembers us all in her prayers. This Sunday I gather with Confirmation Candidates at the Cathedral for the noon Eucharist. Let us remember them and one another in prayer. Love,

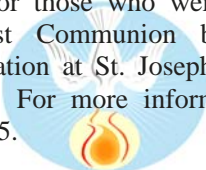
Confirmation Day of Prayer is Sunday, January 7, 2018 beginning with noon Mass at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge.

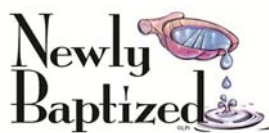
