Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Gratitude

**This Sunday the Scriptures speak of Moses and Prophets who speak in God’s name, and in the Gospel, Jesus teaches with authority and heals in ways unseen before.** All are amazed and grateful for what God does and promises to do in their midst. It is pretty much the same with us here in the parish. Sometimes I go to bed at night and am so filled with gratitude for what our good God seems to be doing for us with us, and through us. Our many ministries in the parish serve as channels for all our loving Father would wish to do for his children.

**This Friday we will have our Ministry Appreciation Supper.** Because Lent and Mardi Gras come so early this year, it will have a Mardi Gras theme. It will feature great food and drink, a great band, but most of all it will include great fellowship and grateful hearts. This will be the core of what brings us all together.

**Two weeks ago we had a photograph in the bulletin of Ann Bevan** who will be doing counseling here at



Immaculate Conception. She is taking the place of Lui Campos who served here for a number of years before retiring in December. We have a bit more of a biography to share with you in this bulletin. Ann is a native of Baton Rouge and has lived in the area all of her life. She completed her undergraduate degree at LSU and, years later,

earned her graduate degree, a Master's in Social Work, from Tulane. She has worked for the state and in the private sector at both inpatient and outpatient medical facilities. **You may hear more about this in the coming weeks, and when we begin Lent, but I wanted to mention it this week so you could give it a bit of thought and reflect on it. This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine’s Day.** I think this gives us a lot to reflect upon as we prepare to begin the Lenten season. It should

help us realize that our Lenten journey is a loving journey. Our Lord’s Passion and death were acts of love, love for you and me, and our Lenten journey is structured to give us an opportunity to respond better to that love, to be more open to give and receive love in response to the great love that calls us together.

There are so many things that could be said about Ash Wednesday being on Valentine’s Day. Our reception of ashes is usually seen as a sign of our desire to turn from what is not of God and embrace more and more what God offers us. Isn’t this what Valentine’s Day expresses? If we really think about it, our coming together this year offers us the opportunity to reflect on the love that is the root and reason for the whole Lenten journey.

Since the earliest days of the Church, the Lenten season has been understood as a time of repentance and spiritual preparation for celebrating the joy of Easter. The focus and purpose of Lent has remained unchanged over the years, and many today have come to consider it an annual retreat of forty days – not a bad thought in our busy world. But why not reflect on the added dimension of the love that calls us to be on this retreat. After all, a retreat is “time with the Lord,” time with the one who has first loved us.

However we may see the coming Lenten season, one thing is clear – it’s God’s gift to us. It is a forty-day period of grace (undeserved gifts), during which we are invited to know God more clearly, follow him for nearly, love him more dearly.

I had an interesting meeting last week. It was the first meeting of the Steering Committee for the Installation of our next Bishop. We don’t know when Bishop Muench’s resignation will be officially accepted, nor when the new bishop will be named, much less how much time we will have to prepare. So, we have begun to meet and have a plan that we can offer our new bishop when he is named. If he wishes to tweak it, he will at least have something to work with.

I thank you for your recommitment to Stewardship of Finance. Stewardship is rooted in happy, grateful hearts. It’s the whole reason for Stewardship, to give back a bit in happy gratitude. Love,

What is the RCIA Rite of Sending? The Rite of Sending offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the catechumens and candidates have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to the bishop with their support. To send a catechumen to the bishop means that a parish has discerned that the person is ready to enter the Catholic Church. In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelations makes reference to a “Book of Life”, in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be baptized. In this Rite, those preparing for Baptism are invited to come forward and sign a book which we call the “Book of the Elect” as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God. Those already baptized had their names written in the Book of Life at their Baptism.

Stump the Deacon!

*Why can't a non-Catholic receive Holy Communion?*

The Eucharist, or Holy Communion, is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, the pinnacle of our faith. Non-Catholics do not put such a high value on the Eucharist. By receiving Holy Communion we are signaling that we are trying to live our lives according to our Catholic faith.

Receiving the Eucharist is an intimate encounter with Christ because we believe that the bread and wine has truly been changed into His Body and Blood. To receive the Eucharist, we must believe that Jesus is fully present. Most non-Catholics do not believe this, so they would be disrespectful and dishonest if they were to partake in the Eucharist.

When we Catholics receive Communion, we show that we are members of the wider Catholic community—literally “in communion” with the Church. We believe that we are in full communion with the Catholic Church, united with our bishop and with the Pope. It would therefore make no sense for a non-Catholic to take Communion because they are separated from the Catholic Church.
